
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the director of
2 public safety was named as a member of the Hawaii interagency
3 council for transit-oriented development when it was established
4 in 2016. In the codification of Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii
5 2022, which reorganized the department of public safety, section
6 226-64(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, was amended to replace the
7 director of public safety with the director of law enforcement.
8 As the council advises on state facilities in transit-oriented
9 development areas, the director of corrections and
10 rehabilitation, who has administrative responsibilities for
11 correctional and rehabilitation facilities statewide, is the
12 more appropriate director to serve on the transit-oriented
13 development council.

14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to replace the
15 director of law enforcement with the director of corrections and
16 rehabilitation as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for
17 transit-oriented development.



1 SECTION 2. Section 226-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) The Hawaii interagency council for transit-oriented
4 development shall be composed of the following members:

5 (1) Director of the office of planning and sustainable
6 development, who shall serve as co-chair;

7 (2) Executive director of the Hawaii housing finance and
8 development corporation, who shall serve as co-chair;

9 (3) Chief of staff, office of the governor;

10 (4) Chairperson of the board of land and natural
11 resources;

12 (5) Director of transportation;

13 (6) Comptroller;

14 (7) Director of health;

15 (8) Director of human services;

16 (9) Director of [~~law enforcement~~] corrections and
17 rehabilitation;

18 (10) Chairperson of the Hawaiian homes commission;

19 (11) Chairperson of the stadium authority;

20 (12) President of the [~~University~~] university of Hawaii;

21 (13) Superintendent of education;



- 1 (14) Executive director of the Hawaii community development
2 authority;
- 3 (15) Executive director of the Hawaii public housing
4 authority;
- 5 (16) One member of the house of representatives to be
6 designated by the speaker of the house of
7 representatives; provided that the speaker of the
8 house of representatives may designate a second member
9 of the house of representatives to serve as an
10 alternate;
- 11 (17) One member of the senate to be designated by the
12 president of the senate; provided that the president
13 of the senate may designate a second member of the
14 senate to serve as an alternate;
- 15 (18) The mayor of each county;
- 16 (19) A representative of the Honolulu field office of the
17 United States Department of Housing and Urban
18 Development, who shall be requested to serve on a
19 nonvoting[+], [+] ex officio basis by the governor;
- 20 (20) A representative of the business community, to be
21 designated by the governor;



- 1 (21) A representative of the community who is a housing
2 advocate, to be designated by the governor; and
3 (22) A representative of the community with experience in
4 housing and real estate development, to be designated
5 by the governor."

6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
