## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the director of 2 public safety was named as a member of the Hawaii interagency 3 council for transit-oriented development when it was established in 2016. In the codification of Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii 4 5 2022, which reorganized the department of public safety, section 6 226-64(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, was amended to replace the 7 director of public safety with the director of law enforcement. 8 As the council advises on state facilities in transit-oriented 9 development areas, the director of corrections and 10 rehabilitation, who has administrative responsibilities for 11 correctional and rehabilitation facilities statewide, is the 12 more appropriate director to serve on the transit-oriented 13 development council.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to replace the director of law enforcement with the director of corrections and rehabilitation as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for transit-oriented development.
