A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR WILDFIRE RECOVERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the devastating
 wildfires brought on by winds from Hurricane Dora on August 8,
 2023, resulted in one of the worst natural disasters in the
 State's history. The wildfires caused loss of life and
 displacement of thousands on the island of Maui. The disaster
 also destroyed nearly all of Lahaina.

7 The legislature further finds that the constitutional 8 responsibility and power to appropriate rests solely with the 9 legislature. Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was enacted 10 to provide the administration with sufficient ability, during 11 disasters or emergencies of unprecedented size and 12 destructiveness, to ensure the safety of the public and recovery 13 of the State.

14 The legislature further finds that transparency, 15 communication, coordination, and collaboration between all 16 branches of government is necessary to develop and implement 17 solutions for survivors. In total, more than \$1,000,000,000, or

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ten per cent, of the general fund budget may be necessary to
 respond to this disaster.

The legislature further finds that to support response and 3 4 recovery efforts and address immediate 2023 wildfire funding 5 needs, the governor, through the seventh emergency proclamation 6 relating to wildfires, dated September 8, 2023, and executive 7 memorandum no. 23-08, redirected \$172,800,000 from selected 8 general fund operating appropriations from Act 164, Session Laws 9 of Hawaii 2023, originally intended for specific purposes and 10 capital improvement projects, to the department of budget and 11 finance. The department of budget and finance subsequently 12 transferred the \$172,800,000 to the major disaster fund and 13 other purposes, along with another \$30,000,000 that the governor 14 authorized pursuant to section 5 of Act 164, Session Laws of 15 Hawaii 2023. With the existing \$5,000,000 major disaster fund 16 appropriation, a total of \$199,100,000 has been allocated to the 17 major disaster fund for initial wildfire response and recovery, 18 including the expected State's share of noncongregate housing 19 and debris clean-up costs initially being paid by the Federal 20 Emergency Management Agency.

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1	The	legislature further finds that the federal government
2	has alloc	ated \$2,000,000,000 to address recovery efforts in
3	Hawaii.	This allocation requires Federal Emergency Management
4	Agency ap	proval before it can be spent.
5	The	legislature notes that this Act is a vital component to
6	funding w	ildfire recovery. Just as critical is longer term,
7	permanent	, comprehensive base budget funding for programs and
8	initiativ	es that will better prepare the State for future
9	disasters	in terms of prevention and planning, which can be
10	found in	the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2024 for fiscal
11	year 2024-2025. The supplemental executive budget appropriates	
12	\$69,538,8	98 that includes:
13	(1)	\$364,000 for 3.0 positions in the department of
14		business, economic development, and tourism;
15	(2)	\$125,000 for temporary libraries in Makawao and
16		Lahaina;
17	(3)	\$12,751,554 for emergency management purposes in the
18		department of human services;
19	(4)	\$424,344 for 6.0 positions in the Hawaii emergency
20		management agency;

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1	(5)	\$1,900,000 for consultant contracts for utility
2		dockets at the public utilities commission;
3	(6)	\$20,974,000 for wildfire response, rehabilitation,
4		fuel reduction, and fire and emergency response
5		equipment at the department of land and natural
6		resources; and
7	(7)	\$33,000,000 for the repair and rehabilitation of
8		highways in Lahaina.
9	The	legislature further finds that uncertainty with the
10	status of	Federal Emergency Management Agency eligible and
11	ineligible expenses remain, making accurate appropriations an	
12	extreme challenge.	
13	The p	purpose of this Act is to make appropriations to cover
14	the State	's expenses incurred in the Hawaii wildfires disaster
15	response e	efforts, ensuring that critical state programs retain
16	funding ap	opropriated by the legislature that is necessary for
17	their cont	tinued operation, and to continue the Hawaii wildfires
18	disaster 1	response and recovery efforts by allocating
19	\$459,720,0	000 as follows:
20	(1)	Appropriating \$200,000,000 to ensure that insurance
21		proceeds are allocated as needed;

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1	(2)	Appropriating \$186,160,000 relating to the State's
2		response to the Maui wildfires and statewide wildfire
3		mitigation and response;
4	(3)	Appropriating \$10,000,000 to the department of land
5		and natural resources for fire and emergency response
6		equipment; and
7	(4)	Authorizing \$63,560,000 of reimbursable general
8		obligation funded capital improvement projects.
9	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the state risk
10	management revolving fund established by section 41D-4, Hawaii	
11	Revised Statutes, the sum of \$200,000,000 or so much thereof as	
12	may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for disbursement of	
13	insurance	claim payments related to the Hawaii wildfires
14	disaster	that began on August 8, 2023; provided that the
15	departmen	t of accounting and general services shall submit the
16	following	information associated with the Hawaii wildfires
17	disaster	that began on August 8, 2023, to the legislature on the
18	seventh da	ay of each month:
19	(1)	The date of insurance proceeds allocation;
20	(2)	The amount of proceeds allocated;
21	(3)	The date of any expenditures;

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1 (4)The amount of expenditures made; 2 (5) The purpose of expenditures; 3 (6) Any contracts executed for the expenditure of funds; 4 (7) The liquidation date for all contracts or liabilities; 5 and 6 (8) A detailed explanation of the public purposes served 7 by the expenditure of resources. 8 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor shall 9 submit to the legislature a summary report containing the 10 aforementioned information for the previous twelve-month period 11 from December 1 to November 30 no later than thirty days prior 12 to the convening of the regular session of 2025. 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 accounting and general services, state risk management and 15 insurance administration (AGS 203), for the purposes of this 16 Act, with the approval of the comptroller. 17 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$186,160,000 or so 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 as a 20 set-aside for recovery costs for the Hawaii wildfires disaster 21 that began on August 8, 2023; provided that notwithstanding any

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1 law to the contrary, the governor may authorize the transfer of 2 up to \$186,160,000 in general funds to other state agencies for 3 recovery costs for the Hawaii wildfires disaster that began on 4 August 8, 2023; provided further that the governor shall provide 5 notice to the legislature fourteen days prior to the date of any 6 transfer and submit a report to the legislature within five days 7 of each use of this authority; provided further that the report 8 shall include the date of transfer, the amount of the transfer, 9 the program ID to which funds were transferred, and an 10 explanation of the purpose of the transfer of resources.

Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor shall submit to the legislature a summary report containing the aforementioned information for each use of this authority for the previous twelve-month period from December 1 to November 30 no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of 2025 and 2026.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18 budget and finance, departmental administration and budget
19 division (BUF 101), for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the21 department of budget and finance or any department or agency

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1 receiving funds transferred by the governor shall submit the 2 following information associated with the Hawaii wildfires 3 disaster that began on August 8, 2023, to the legislature on the 4 seventh day of each month: 5 (1)The date of expenditures; 6 (2) The amount of expenditures made, separately for 7 Federal Emergency Management Agency eligible and 8 Federal Emergency Management Agency ineligible 9 expenses; 10 (3) The purpose of expenditures; 11 (4) Any contracts executed for the expenditure of funds; 12 (5) The liquidation date for all contracts or liabilities; 13 and 14 (6) A detailed explanation of the public purposes served 15 by the expenditure of resources. 16 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor shall 17 submit to the legislature a summary report containing the 18 aforementioned information for the previous twelve-month period 19 from December 1 to November 30 no later than thirty days prior 20 to the convening of the regular session of 2025.

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1	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000,000 or so
3	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
4	fire and	emergency response equipment.
5	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
6	land and	natural resources, native resources and fire protection
7	program (LNR 402), for the purposes of this Act.
8	SECT	ION 6. The director of finance is authorized to issue
9	reimbursa	ble general obligation bonds in the sum of \$63,560,000
10	and the s	ame sum or so much thereof as may be necessary is
11	appropria	ted for fiscal year 2024-2025 as follows:
12	(1)	\$4,560,000 for a final disposition site;
13	(2)	\$11,000,000 for wastewater collection system repairs;
14	(3)	\$9,000,000 for wastewater collection system laterals
15		and cleanouts;
16	(4)	\$3,000,000 for traffic signal replacement;
17	(5)	\$10,000,000 for fire flow improvements to water
18		systems;
19	(6)	\$10,000,000 for water supply infrastructure repairs
20		and replacements;

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1	(7) \$8,000,000 for storm drainage, flood control, and		
2	water quality improvements; and		
3	(8) \$8,000,000 for roadway connectivity for disaster		
4	evacuation.		
5	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of		
6	Maui through (SUB 401) for the purposes of this Act; provided		
7	that the county of Maui shall reimburse the State for all		
8	interest payments made on the debt service of the reimbursable		
9	general obligation bonds; provided further that any		
10	reimbursements received by the State from the Federal Emergency		
11	Management Agency shall be credited towards any principal		
12	payments made by the state treasury for the reimbursable general		
13	obligation bonds issued.		
14	SECTION 7. The appropriations made for the capital		
15	improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at		
16	the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriations are		
17	made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations		
18	unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.		
19	SECTION 8. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of		
20	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,		
21	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the		

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appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 1 2 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 3 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the 4 appropriations contained in this Act will cause the general fund 5 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further per cent. The combined total 6 exceeded by \$ or 7 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 8 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 9 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 10 per cent. The reasons for exceeding the \$ or 11 general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 12 (1)The appropriations made in this Act are necessary to 13 serve the public interest; and 14 (2) The appropriations made in this Act meet the needs 15 addressed by this Act. 16 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
