A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH PRINT DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public utilities 2 commission provides critical services that ensure access to a 3 basic set of essential telecommunications services for 4 individuals who are blind or visually impaired. In 2023, the governor signed Act 247, Session Laws of 5 6 Hawaii 2023, into law, appropriating funds out of the public 7 utilities commission special fund for the public utilities commission to provide free telecommunications access to certain 8 9 information for persons with a print disability. Act 247 10 provided \$150,000 for both fiscal year 2023-2024 and fiscal year 11 2024-2025. The legislature finds that Act 247 provides funding 12 for an important service that would be most appropriately funded 13 on an ongoing basis directly by telecommunication carriers whose services are being supplemented rather than through the public 14 utilities commission special fund, which is largely funded 15

through a surcharge to electric ratepayers. The public

- 2 currently administered by the department of human services.
- 3 The legislature further finds that section 269-41, Hawaii
- 4 Revised Statutes, established the universal service program, the
- 5 purpose of which, in relevant part, is to, assist customers with
- 6 disabilities, in obtaining and maintaining access to a basic set
- 7 of essential telecommunications services as determined by the
- 8 commission. Additionally, section 269-42(e), Hawaii Revised
- 9 Statutes, requires the public utilities commission to require
- 10 all telecommunications carriers to contribute to the universal
- 11 service program. However, the universal service program is
- 12 currently not active and there are no funds in the universal
- 13 service fund. The public utilities commission also lacks clear
- 14 legislative authorization to develop a program for print
- 15 disability using the universal service fund. Further, the
- 16 public utilities commission does not have budget authorization
- 17 to expend funds for such purpose.
- 18 The purpose of this Act, therefore, is to clarify that,
- 19 under the universal service program, the public utilities
- 20 commission may provide free telephonic access and
- 21 telecommunication services for individuals with print
- 22 disabilities utilizing the universal service fund and may

- 1 determine the percentage of certain fees collected to be
- 2 deposited into the universal service fund. This Act also
- 3 authorizes the public utilities commission to expend funds from
- 4 the universal service fund for the provision of services for
- 5 individuals with print disabilities.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding to part I a new section to be appropriately
- 8 designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "§269- Universal service program; access for individuals
- 10 with print disabilities. (a) Under the universal service
- 11 program, the public utilities commission may use available funds
- 12 from the universal service fund to provide free telephonic
- 13 access to time-sensitive information, including but not limited
- 14 to state and local government information, public notices,
- 15 emergency alerts, job opportunities, daily newspapers, and other
- 16 content, to allow individuals who are blind or visually impaired
- 17 to access information and services, so long as the amount of
- 18 funds expended from the universal service fund does not exceed
- 19 \$. The telephonic access shall be configured accessible
- to and usable by persons with print disabilities.

1	(b) The public utilities commission may determine the
2	percentage of telecommunications fees necessary to deposit in
3	the universal service fund to implement the program."

PURPOSE:

To clarify that, under the Universal Service Program, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) may provide free telephonic access and telecommunication services for individuals with print disabilities utilizing the Universal Service Fund; and the Commission may determine the percentage of certain fees collected to be deposited into the Universal Service Fund to be used for the implementation of the program, and

expend such funds.

MEANS:

Add a new section to part I of chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Act 247, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, appropriated funds from the Public Utilities Commission Special Fund for the Commission to provide free telecommunications access to certain information for persons with a print disability. This bill will ensure continuation of the ongoing services specified in Act 247 and uses the Universal Service Fund to implement the program.

Impact on the public: Secures telephonic access and telecommunication services for individuals with print disabilities, subject to available funding.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The Commission will be able to use the
Universal Service Fund supported by
telecommunications carriers' contributions
rather than the Public Utilities Special
Fund. The Commission's program will enhance
the Hoʻopono Services currently administered
by the Department of Human Services.
