A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The purpose of this Act is to permanently SECTION 1. 2 exempt an additional administrative assistant position in the 3 Hawaii State Public Library System from civil service. SECTION 2. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 6 "(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall 7 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter 8 established and embrace all personal services performed for the 9 State, except the following: 10 (1) Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii 11 National Guard as such, and positions in the Hawaii 12 National Guard that are required by state or federal . 13 laws or regulations or orders of the National Guard to 14 be filled from those commissioned or enlisted 15 personnel; 16 (2) Positions filled by persons employed by contract where 17 the director of human resources development has 18 certified that the service is special or unique or is

1		essential to the public interest and that, because of
2		circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel
3		to perform the service cannot be obtained through
4		normal civil service recruitment procedures. Any such
5		contract may be for any period not exceeding one year;
6	(3)	Positions that must be filled without delay to comply
7		with a court order or decree if the director
8		determines that recruitment through normal recruitment
9		civil service procedures would result in delay or
10		noncompliance, such as the Felix-Cayetano consent
11		decree;
12	(4)	Positions filled by the legislature or by either house
13		or any committee thereof;
14	(5)	Employees in the office of the governor and office of
15		the lieutenant governor, and household employees at
16		Washington Place;
17	(6)	Positions filled by popular vote;
18	(7)	Department heads, officers, and members of any board,
19		commission, or other state agency whose appointments
20		are made by the governor or are required by law to be
21		confirmed by the senate;

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(8) Judges, referees, receivers, masters, jurors, notaries public, land court examiners, court commissioners, and attorneys appointed by a state court for a special temporary service;

One bailiff for the chief justice of the supreme court (9) who shall have the powers and duties of a court officer and bailiff under section 606-14; one secretary or clerk for each justice of the supreme court, each judge of the intermediate appellate court, and each judge of the circuit court; one secretary for the judicial council; one deputy administrative director of the courts; three law clerks for the chief justice of the supreme court, two law clerks for each associate justice of the supreme court and each judge of the intermediate appellate court, one law clerk for each judge of the circuit court, two additional law clerks for the civil administrative judge of the circuit court of the first circuit, two additional law clerks for the criminal administrative judge of the circuit court of the first circuit, one additional law clerk for the senior judge of the family court of the

first circuit, two additional law clerks for the civil

1 motions judge of the circuit court of the first circuit, two additional law clerks for the criminal 2 3 motions judge of the circuit court of the first circuit, and two law clerks for the administrative 4 5 judge of the district court of the first circuit; and one private secretary for the administrative director 6 7 of the courts, the deputy administrative director of the courts, each department head, each deputy or first 8 9 assistant, and each additional deputy, or assistant 10 deputy, or assistant defined in paragraph (16); 11 First deputy and deputy attorneys general, the (10) administrative services manager of the department of 12 13 the attorney general, one secretary for the 14 administrative services manager, an administrator and 15 any support staff for the criminal and juvenile 16 justice resources coordination functions, and law 17 clerks; Teachers, principals, vice-principals, complex 18 (11)(A) area superintendents, deputy and assistant 19 superintendents, other certificated personnel, no 20 21 more than twenty noncertificated administrative,

1			professional, and technical personnel not engaged
2			in instructional work;
3		(B)	Effective July 1, 2003, teaching assistants,
4			educational assistants, bilingual/bicultural
5			school-home assistants, school psychologists,
6			psychological examiners, speech pathologists,
7			athletic health care trainers, alternative school
8			work study assistants, alternative school
9			educational/supportive services specialists,
10			alternative school project coordinators, and
11			communications aides in the department of
12			education;
13		(C)	The special assistant to the state librarian and
14			one secretary for the special assistant to the
15			state librarian; and
16		(D)	Members of the faculty of the University of
17			Hawaii, including research workers, extension
18			agents, personnel engaged in instructional work,
19			and administrative, professional, and technical
20			personnel of the university;
21	(12)	Emp]	loyees engaged in special, research, or
22		demo	onstration projects approved by the governor;

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2	(13)	(A)	Positions filled by inmates, patients of state
3			institutions, persons with severe physical or
4			mental disabilities participating in the work
5			experience training programs;
6		(B)	Positions filled with students in accordance with
7			guidelines for established state employment
8			programs; and
9		(C)	Positions that provide work experience training
10			or temporary public service employment that are
11			filled by persons entering the workforce or
12			persons transitioning into other careers under
13			programs such as the federal Workforce Investment
14			Act of 1998, as amended, or the Senior Community
15			Service Employment Program of the Employment and
16			Training Administration of the United States
17			Department of Labor, or under other similar state
18			programs;
19	(14)	A cu	stodian or guide at Iolani Palace, the Royal
20		Maus	coleum, and Hulihee Palace;
21	(15)	Posi	tions filled by persons employed on a fee,
22		cont	ract, or piecework basis, who may lawfully perform

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their duties concurrently with their private business or profession or other private employment and whose duties require only a portion of their time, if it is impracticable to ascertain or anticipate the portion of time to be devoted to the service of the State; (16)Positions of first deputies or first assistants of each department head appointed under or in the manner provided in section 6, article V, of the Hawaii State Constitution; three additional deputies or assistants either in charge of the highways, harbors, and airports divisions or other functions within the department of transportation as may be assigned by the director of transportation, with the approval of the governor; one additional deputy in the department of human services either in charge of welfare or other functions within the department as may be assigned by the director of human services; four additional deputies in the department of health, each in charge of one of the following: behavioral health, environmental health, hospitals, and health resources administration, including other functions within the department as may be assigned by the director of

1		health, with the approval of the governor; two
2		additional deputies in charge of the law enforcement
3		programs, administration, or other functions within
4		the department of law enforcement as may be assigned
5		by the director of law enforcement, with the approval
6		of the governor; three additional deputies each in
7		charge of the correctional institutions,
8		rehabilitation services and programs, and
9		administration or other functions within the
10		department of corrections and rehabilitation as may be
11		assigned by the director of corrections and
12		rehabilitation, with the approval of the governor;
13		[an] two administrative [assistant] assistants to the
14		state librarian; and an administrative assistant to
15		the superintendent of education;
16	(17)	Positions specifically exempted from this part by any
17		other law; provided that:
18		(A) Any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall
19		expire three years after its enactment unless
20		affirmatively extended by an act of the
21		legislature; and

1		(B) All of the positions defined by paragraph (9)
2		shall be included in the position classification
3		plan;
4	(18)	Positions in the state foster grandparent program and
5		positions for temporary employment of senior citizens
6		in occupations in which there is a severe personnel
7		shortage or in special projects;
8	(19)	Household employees at the official residence of the
9		president of the University of Hawaii;
10	(20)	Employees in the department of education engaged in
11		the supervision of students during meal periods in the
12		distribution, collection, and counting of meal
13		tickets, and in the cleaning of classrooms after
14		school hours on a less than half-time basis;
15	(21)	Employees hired under the tenant hire program of the
16		Hawaii public housing authority; provided that not
17		more than twenty-six per cent of the authority's
18		workforce in any housing project maintained or
19		operated by the authority shall be hired under the
20		tenant hire program;
21	(22)	Positions of the federally funded expanded food and
22		nutrition program of the University of Hawaii that

1		require the hiring of nutrition program assistants who
2		live in the areas they serve;
3	(23)	Positions filled by persons with severe disabilities
4		who are certified by the state vocational
5		rehabilitation office that they are able to perform
6		safely the duties of the positions;
7	(24)	The sheriff;
8	(25)	A gender and other fairness coordinator hired by the
9		judiciary;
10	(26)	Positions in the Hawaii National Guard youth and adult
11		education programs;
12	(27)	In the state energy office in the department of
13		business, economic development, and tourism, all
14		energy program managers, energy program specialists,
15		energy program assistants, and energy analysts;
16	(28)	Administrative appeals hearing officers in the
17		department of human services;
18	(29)	In the Med-QUEST division of the department of human
19		services, the division administrator, finance officer,
20		health care services branch administrator, medical
21		director, and clinical standards administrator;

1	(30)	In the director's office of the department of human
2		services, the enterprise officer, information security
3		and privacy compliance officer, security and privacy
4		compliance engineer, security and privacy compliance
5		analyst, information technology implementation
6		manager, assistant information technology
7		implementation manager, resource manager,
8		community/project development director, policy
9		director, special assistant to the director, and
10		limited English proficiency project
11		manager/coordinator;
12	(31)	The Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services
13		coordinator in the executive office on aging;
14	(32)	In the Hawaii emergency management agency, the
15		executive officer, public information officer, civil
16		defense administrative officer, branch chiefs, and
17		emergency operations center state warning point
18		personnel; provided that for state warning point
19		personnel, the director shall determine that
20		recruitment through normal civil service recruitment
21		procedures would result in delay or noncompliance;

PURPOSE:

To permanently exempt an additional administrative assistant position in the Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS)

from civil service.

MEANS:

Amend Section 76-16(b), Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Act 88, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, created a new administrative assistant position in HSPLS. The new administrative assistant position was intended to be permanently exempt from civil service, similar to a pre-existing exempt administrative assistant position. The appropriate amendments to section 76-16(b), HRS, were not enacted at the time the new administrative assistant position was created.

Without the amendments to section 76-16(b), the HSPLS will have one administrative assistant position that is exempt from civil service requirements and one position that is not. This amendment is consistent with the intention that HSPLS have two exempt administrative assistants.
