A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii health
 corps program was established in 2012 with a focus on
 encouraging certain health care providers to serve in counties
 that are experiencing shortages of physicians, physician
 assistants, and nurse practitioners, with a priority given to a
 rural area county.

 The legislature further finds that since that time, while
 the need for these providers in these areas remains, there is as
- 8 the need for these providers in these areas remains, there is an
 9 increased need for a wider range of health care providers, as
 10 well as a pressing need for practitioners in mental health.
- The legislature further finds that on September 9, 2023,
 the State launched the healthcare education loan repayment
 program (HELP), a separate program that is alleviating the
 educational debt of four hundred ninety-two medical and
 healthcare professionals. Because of the expanded scope and
 purpose of HELP, the purpose of this Act is to clarify the name
 of the Hawaii health corps program and rename it to the Hawaii

- 1 rural health care provider loan program to better reflect the
- 2 purpose of the program.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 309H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending the definition of "loan repayment" or
- 5 "repayment of loan" to read as follows:
- 6 ""Loan repayment" or "repayment of loan" means the payment
- 7 of up to twenty per cent of a Hawaii [health corps] rural health
- 8 care provider loan program participant's health care training
- 9 costs including but not limited to tuition not exceeding \$35,000
- 10 per year for a maximum of five years of repayment."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 309H-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "\$309H-2 Hawaii [health corps] rural health care provider
- 14 loan program established. The Hawaii [health-corps] rural
- 15 health care provider loan program is established to encourage
- 16 physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners to
- 17 serve in counties having a shortage of physicians, physician
- 18 assistants, and nurse practitioners, with priority given to a
- 19 rural area county. The Hawaii [health corps] rural health care
- 20 provider loan program shall be administered by the University of
- 21 Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of

- 1 Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene. In
- 2 administering the program, the University of Hawaii John A.
- 3 Burns school of medicine and the University of Hawaii at Manoa
- 4 school of nursing and dental hygiene shall:
- 5 (1) Adopt rules and develop guidelines to administer the6 program;
- 7 (2) Identify and designate areas of the counties where 8 there is a shortage of physicians, physician 9 assistants, and nurse practitioners;
- 10 (3) Establish criteria for the selection by the University
 11 of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine of
 12 physicians, physician assistants, and nurse
 13 practitioners to participate in the Hawaii rural
 14 health care provider loan repayment program;
 - (4) Define and determine compliance with the service commitments of the Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment program;

11		participants into service during an emergency or
12		disaster."

- 12 Loan repayments shall commence upon the commencement of loan
- 13 repayments by the Hawaii rural health care provider loan
- 14 repayment program recipient to the lending financial
- 15 institution. The University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of
- 16 medicine and the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing
- 17 and dental hygiene shall prioritize loan repayments in
- 18 accordance with the greatest specialty shortages for the
- 19 particular county."
- 20 2. By amending subsection (c) to read:

- 8 physician assistants, and nurse practitioners participating in
- 9 the Hawaii [health corps] rural health care provider loan
- 10 program may be ordered into service by the governor as first
- 11 responders to serve in areas of the State and in a capacity
- 12 determined by the director of health. "
- 13 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
