## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRESCHOOL OPEN DOORS PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:


1 The legislature finds that the preschool open SECTION 1. 2 doors program serves certain three- and four-year old children 3 with priority extended to certain categories of children. There 4 is currently no priority application period established for each state fiscal year. A priority application period would ensure 5 6 that the preschool open doors program maximizes the funding 7 appropriated to the program to serve the greatest number of 8 three- and four-year-old children in a more timely fashion. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to explicitly 9

10 establish that the priority of selection for preschool open 11 doors program participation applies only during the priority 12 application period between February 1 and the start of each 13 state fiscal year.

SECTION 2. Section 346-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:



Establishes that the priority of selection for participation in the Preschool Open Doors Program applies only during the priority application period that occurs prior to the start of each state fiscal year. Establishes that applications received after the start of the fiscal year through January 31 shall be processed continuously through the fiscal year on a first-come, first-served basis. (CD1)
