A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended by amending section (b) to read as follows:

"(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall 3

4 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter

established and embrace all personal services performed for the

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Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii (1) National Guard as such, and positions in the Hawaii National Guard that are required by state or federal laws or regulations or orders of the National Guard to be filled from those commissioned or enlisted

> (2) Positions filled by persons employed by contract where the director of human resources development has certified that the service is special or unique or is essential to the public interest and that, because of circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel

to perform the service cannot be obtained through 18

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    amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

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    and section 26-35(a)(4), an executive director[\tau] and an
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    executive assistant, whose salaries shall be set by the board
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    established under section 356D-3. The executive director shall
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    employ, exempt from chapter 76 and section 26-35(a)(4), a chief
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    financial [management advisor,] officer, a property management
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    branch chief, a chief planner, [and] a redevelopment officer, a

    chief compliance officer, a housing contract and procurement
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1 officer, a human resources and safety officer, and a housing 2 policy and program coordinator, whose salaries shall be set by 3 the [board established under section 356D-3; provided that no 4 salary shall exceed the governor's salary.] executive director. The authority may employ, subject to chapter 76, technical 5 6 experts and officers, agents, and employees, permanent or 7 temporary, as required. The [authority] executive director may 8 also employ officers, agents, and employees; prescribe their 9 duties and qualifications; and fix and adjust their salaries, 10 not subject to chapter 76[-7] or section 26-35(a)(4), when in the 11 determination of the [authority,] executive director, the 12 services to be performed are unique and essential to the 13 execution of the functions of the authority; provided that if 14 the authority hires an officer, agent, or employee in a capacity 15 not subject to chapter 76, the authority shall include in an 16 annual report to the legislature, to be submitted not later than 17 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, the 18 position descriptions and reasons for hiring the personnel in a 19 civil service exempt capacity. Description:

Establishes, exempt from chapter 76, the position of a Housing Policy and Program Coordinator in the Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA), whose salary shall be set by the Executive Director of the HPHA. Clarifies that the employment of certain positions and the adjustment of salaries are authorized by the Executive Director and not the Board of Directors. Deletes the wage ceiling requirement for positions in the HPHA.

DEPARTMENT: Human Services

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII

PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

PURPOSE: To establish, exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii

Revised Statutes (HRS), the position of a Housing Policy and Program Coordinator in the Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA), whose salary shall be set by the Executive Director, clarify that the employment of certain positions and the adjustment of salaries are authorized by the Executive Director and not the Board of Directors, and delete the wage ceiling requirements for

positions in the HPHA.

MEANS: Amend sections 76-16(b) and 356D-2(b), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: This bill will add the new Housing

This bill will add the new Housing Policy and Program Coordinator position that will be responsible for organizing, implementing, overall program management, and evaluating housing programs to shape the future of the HPHA. Additional responsibilities will be attaining program and project results and leading and participating in efforts to build program support with internal and external program stakeholders.

This bill will also clarify the title of the Chief Financial Officer, codify the Chief Compliance Officer, Housing Contract and Procurement Officer, and Human Resources and Safety Officer positions that were established exempt from section 76-16(b) before 2014, clarify that the staff report to the Executive Director, and authorize the Executive Director to hire staff that may need salaries that are required to be above the Governor's salary due to the HPHA's redevelopment efforts.

Impact on the public: There should be a
positive impact on the public as the HPHA

will be able to process documentation to other state departments and agencies more quickly.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The HPHA will be able to recruit and retain the most talented management personnel to improve federal scores.
