A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide 2 parking program for persons with disabilities, as established 3 under part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant 4 to the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons With 5 Disabilities, 23 C.F.R. §1235, and administered by the 6 disability and communication access board, provides individuals 7 with mobility disabilities the ability to travel and park in 8 accessible parking spaces via the use of parking placards. 9 However, improper use and insufficient enforcement impact access 10 for legitimate program participants.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to assure appropriate use of placards by expanding enforcement at the municipal level.

SECTION 2. Section 286-119, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: "(a) The examiner of drivers may suspend any driver's license without hearing when the examiner:

19	(1)	Fails to properly display a disability parking permit;
20	(2)	Displays an invalid disability parking permit;

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1	(3)	Uses a disability parking permit that was not issued
2		to that person or to any passengers occupying the
3		vehicle in the parking space; [or]
4	(4)	Displays a disability parking permit that was issued
5		to a person who was deceased at the time of the
6		display; or
7	[(4)]	(5) With or without a disability parking permit:
8		(A) Parks in an access aisle; or
9		(B) Obstructs the ingress or egress to a parking
10		space reserved for a person with a disability;
11	shall be	guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and
12	shall be	fined [no] not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 and
13	pay any c	osts incurred by the court related to assessing the
14	fine; pro	vided that a person with a disability who has been
15	issued a	valid disability parking permit that is currently in
16	effect, a	nd who has failed to display the disability parking
17	permit wh	ile parking in a space reserved for persons with
18	disabilit	ies, shall pay a fine of [no] <u>not</u> less than \$25 nor
19	more than	\$100 and any costs incurred by the court related to
20	assessing	the fine.

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1 Any person who uses a parking space reserved for (b) 2 persons with disabilities and refuses or fails to present an 3 identification card issued under this chapter or the rules adopted thereunder to an enforcement officer upon request shall 4 5 be guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and shall 6 be fined [no] not less than \$250 nor more than \$500. 7 (C) Any citation issued under this chapter may be mailed 8 to the violator pursuant to section 291C-165(b). 9 (d) The court shall distribute fifty per cent of the fine 10 imposed on any person who is found quilty of or pleads quilty to 11 violating this section to the law enforcement agency that issued 12 the citation." 13 SECTION 4. Section 291-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "[4] §291-58[]] Requirement to provide parking for persons 16 with disabilities; [penalty.] ordinances to enforce authorized. 17 [Beginning July 1, 2002, any public or private entity that 18 provides a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities 19 shall comply with this part and any administrative rules adopted 20 under this part. A private entity that fails to comply with 21 this section shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than



1	\$500 for	each separate offense. Each day of violation shall	
2	constitute a separate offense. Any action taken to impose or		
3	collect any penalty provided for in this section shall be		
4	considered a civil action.] (a) Each county may enact		
5	ordinances to:		
6	(1)	Enforce the design and construction requirements of	
7		this part, and any administrative rules adopted	
8		pursuant to this part, pertaining to the provision of	
9		parking spaces and access to parking spaces reserved	
10		for persons with disabilities, including but not	
11		limited to the number, location, design, and signage	
12		of these parking spaces; and	
13	(2)	Establish penalties for failure to comply with the	
14		ordinances enacted pursuant to this section.	
15	<u>(b)</u>	An official appointed by a county may enter the	
16	property	of places of public accommodation to enforce any	
17	applicabl	e ordinances enacted pursuant to this section.	
18	(c)	For the purpose of this section, "place of public	
19	accommodation" shall have the same meaning as defined in section		
20	<u>489-2.</u> "

Report Title: Disabled Persons Parking

Description:

Authorizes the Examiner of Drivers to suspend the driver's license of a person using a parking permit issued to a deceased person who was deceased when the permit was issued to obtain parking privileges. Provides that fifty per cent of any fine imposed for violating part III of chapter 291, HRS, is remitted to the law enforcement agency that issued the citation. Authorizes each county to enact ordinances to enforce the design and construction requirements for the provision of accessible parking spaces, including the establishment of penalties for failure to comply with the ordinances. Authorizes officials appointed by a county to enter the property of places of public accommodation to enforce violations of the county ordinances. (SD1)

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
