A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding to part III a new section to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§103D-</u> Alternative procurements. (a) A procuring
5	agency may select an alternative procurement method when the
6	alternative procurement method is made part of a federal
7	statute, federal regulation, federal special experimental, or
8	demonstration project, or by federal approval of the alternative
9	procurement method.
10	(b) The head of a purchasing agency shall determine in
11	writing that it is neither practicable nor advantageous to the
12	State to procure using the other methods in section 103D-301
13	before selecting the use of the alternative procurement method.
14	(c) Documentation of the federal statute, federal
15	regulation, federal special experimental, or federal
16	demonstration project, or the federal approval of the

2	contract	file.	"
3	SECT	ION 2	. Section 103D-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y ame	nding subsection (b) to read as follows:
5	"(b)	Not	withstanding subsection (a), this chapter shall
6	not apply	to c	ontracts by governmental bodies:
7	(1)	Soli	cited or entered into before July 1, 1994, unless
8		the	parties agree to its application to a contract
9		soli	cited or entered into prior to July 1, 1994;
10	(2)	To d	isburse funds, irrespective of their source:
11		(A)	For grants as defined in section 42F-101, made by
12			the State in accordance with standards provided
13			by law as required by article VII, section 4, of
14			the state constitution; or by the counties
15			pursuant to their respective charters or
16			ordinances;
17		(B)	To make payments to or on behalf of public
18			officers and employees for salaries, fringe
19			benefits, professional fees, or reimbursements;
20		(C)	To satisfy obligations that the State is required
21			to pay by law, including paying fees, permanent



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1		settlements, subsidies, or other claims, making
2		refunds, and returning funds held by the State as
3		trustee, custodian, or bailee;
4	(D)	For entitlement programs, including public
5		assistance, unemployment, and workers'
6		compensation programs, established by state or
7		federal law;
8	(E)	For dues and fees of organizations of which the
9		State or its officers and employees are members,
10		including the National Association of Governors,
11		the National Association of State and County
12		Governments, and the Multi-State Tax Commission;
13	(F)	For deposit, investment, or safekeeping,
14		including expenses related to their deposit,
15		investment, or safekeeping;
16	(G)	To governmental bodies of the State;
17	(H)	As loans, under loan programs administered by a
18		governmental body; and
19	(I)	For contracts awarded in accordance with chapter
20		103F;

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1	(3)	To procure goods, services, or construction from a
2		governmental body other than the University of Hawaii
3		bookstores, from the federal government, or from
4		another state or its political subdivision;
5	(4)	To procure the following [goods or] <u>goods</u> , services,
6		or construction which are available from multiple
7		sources but for which procurement by competitive means
8		is either not practicable or not advantageous to the
9		State:
10		(A) Services of expert witnesses for potential and
11		actual litigation of legal matters involving the
12		State, its agencies, and its officers and
13		employees, including administrative quasi-
14		judicial proceedings;
15		(B) Works of art for museum or public display;
16		(C) Research and reference materials including books,
17		maps, periodicals, and pamphlets, which are
18		published in print, video, audio, magnetic, or
19		electronic form;
20		(D) Meats and foodstuffs for the Kalaupapa
21		settlement;



1	(E)	Opponents for athletic contests;
2	(F)	Utility services whose rates or prices are fixed
3		by regulatory processes or agencies;
4	(G)	Performances, including entertainment, speeches,
5		and cultural and artistic presentations;
6	(H)	Goods and services for commercial resale by the
7		State;
8	(I)	Services of printers, rating agencies, support
9		facilities, fiscal and paying agents, and
10		registrars for the issuance and sale of the
11		State's or counties' bonds;
12	(J)	Services of attorneys employed or retained to
13		advise, represent, or provide any other legal
14		service to the State or any of its agencies, on
15		matters arising under laws of another state or
16		foreign country, or in an action brought in
17		another state, federal, or foreign jurisdiction,
18		when substantially all legal services are
19		expected to be performed outside this State;
20	(K)	Financing agreements under chapter 37D; and

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1	(L)	Any other [goods or] goods, services, or
2		construction which the policy board determines by
3		rules or the chief procurement officer determines
4		in writing is available from multiple sources but
5		for which procurement by competitive means is
6		either not practicable or not advantageous to the
7		State; and
8	(5) Whic	ch are specific procurements expressly exempt from
9	any	or all of the requirements of this chapter by:
10	(A)	References in state or federal law to provisions
11		of this chapter or a section of this chapter, or
12		references to a particular requirement of this
13		chapter; and
14	(B)	Trade agreements, including the Uruguay Round
15		General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT)
16		which require certain non-construction and non-
17		software development procurements by the
18		comptroller to be conducted in accordance with
19		its terms."
20	SECTION 3	3. Section 103D-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended to rea	ad as follows:

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1	"§103D-301 Methods of source selection. Unless otherwise
2	authorized by law, all contracts shall be awarded pursuant to
3	the following sections, as applicable:
4	(1) Section 103D-302 (Competitive sealed bids);
5	(2) Section 103D-303 (Competitive sealed proposals);
6	(3) Section 103D-304 (Professional services procurement);
7	(4) Section 103D-305 (Small purchases);
8	(5) Section 103D-306 (Sole source procurement); [and]
9	(6) Section 103D-307 (Emergency procurements) $[-]$; and
10	(7) Section 103D- (Alternative procurements)."
11	SECTION 4. Section 103D-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
13	"(d) Outside contractors may be utilized to prepare
14	specifications and work statements in the development of a
15	solicitation. Contractors paid for those services shall be
16	precluded from bidding on or receiving a contract when they
17	participated in [any way in] the development of the solicitation
18	package or any resulting contract $[-]$, unless the chief
19	procurement officer determines in writing that it is in the best
20	interest of the State and authorizes a waiver."

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SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.



Report Title:

Methods of Source Selection; Alternative Procurement; and Government Services

Description:

Amends chapter 103D, HRS, to add to part III a new section allowing an alternative procurement method when the federal government provides for or approves the alternative procurement method, and the head of the purchasing agency makes a written determination that it is neither practicable nor advantageous to use the existing statutory procurement methods. Amends sections 103D-102(b)(4) and 103D-102(b)(4)(L), HRS, to exempt certain construction procurement from the Hawaii Public Procurement Code when it is neither practicable nor advantageous to the State. Amends section 103D-301, HRS, methods of source selection, to add the alternative procurement method. Amends section 103D-405, HRS, to allow the Chief Procurement Officer to provide a waiver for certain outside contractors that participated in the development of a solicitation package that would otherwise be precluded from bidding on or receiving a contract. Takes effect 7/1/2112. (SD1)

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
