BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

4	" <u>§141-</u> Local agriculture transportation cost		
5	reimbursement program; rules. (a) There is established within		
6	the department of agriculture a local agriculture transportation		
7	cost reimbursement program to reimburse eligible agricultural		
8	producers for a portion of the producer's costs to transport		
9	agricultural commodities.		
10	(b) To be eligible to receive reimbursement payments		
11	pursuant to this section, an agricultural producer shall:		
12	(1) Be an owner of livestock or producer of agricultural		
13	commodities in the State;		
14	(2) Incur costs for transporting in a covered motor		
15	vehicle or through air cargo, parcel, or water cargo

1		(A) Livestock, livestock products, or agricultural

3		(B) Supplies for the use of the agricultural

8	(c)	The total amount of reimbursement payments disbursed

1 SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 4 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 5 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure 6 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 7 \$ per cent. This current declaration takes or 8 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 9 10 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 11 12 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to 13 serve the public interest; and 14 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 15 addressed by this Act. SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 16 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 19 the department of agriculture to fund and administer the local 20 agriculture transportation cost reimbursement program 21 established pursuant to this Act.
