A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE GESTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the shaka gesture should be recognized as the official gesture of the State.
- 3 While multiple origin theories exist, all theories have the
- 4 shaka developing within the State. More importantly, while
- 5 multiple Hawaii ethnic cultures and resident groups have
- 6 contributed varying layers of meaning to the shaka, there is a
- 7 shared agreement in the shaka's positive sentiments and usage
- $oldsymbol{8}$ toward sharing aloha, fostering connection, and being pono.
- ${f 9}$ The legislature further finds that the shaka is a key brand
- 10 symbol for the State, offering influential power to build the
- 11 State's economy, global brand, and resident pride. As the shaka
- 12 is now used around the world, this Act ensures that Hawaii
- 13 retains recognition as the birthplace of the shaka. It is
- 14 therefore appropriate that the shaka be honored as the official
- 15 gesture of the State to secure recognition of Hawaii as the
- 16 shaka's place of origin, preserve the meaning of the shaka as

- 1 originated in Hawaii, preserve Hawaii's brand association with
- 2 the gesture, and share the aloha spirit around the world.
- Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to adopt, establish,
- 4 and designate the shaka as the official gesture of the State.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 6 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 "\$5- State gesture. The shaka is adopted, established,
- 9 and designated as the official gesture of the State.
- 10 For the purposes of this section, the shaka generally
- 11 consists of extending the thumb and smallest finger while
- 12 holding the three middle fingers curled, and gesturing in
- 13 salutation while presenting the front or back of the hand; the
- 14 wrist may be rotated back and forth for emphasis."
- 15 SECTION 3. The state foundation on culture and the arts
- 16 may develop a public work of art related to the shaka and its
- 17 history to be displayed in a prominent location within the State
- 18 for residents and visitors to Hawaii.
- 19 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
