A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pesticide use is 2 associated with neurological deficits and acute health effects 3 in children. Scientific research conducted by academic 4 institutions and the Environmental Protection Agency has 5 demonstrated that pesticides sprayed on agricultural fields can drift off site, causing adverse health effects. Drift can occur 6 7 through spray, mist, fumes, or odor during application, or 8 through volatilization of previously treated areas.

9 The legislature further finds that Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, created a ban on chlorpyrifos--an excellent example 10 of state regulatory action to protect the public from 11 neurologically damaging pesticides. However, the legislature 12 also finds that the one hundred foot buffer zone for schools is 13 insufficient. Pesticide drift can occur at distances up to 0.8 14 mile, or 4,224 feet, from the site of application. 15 The legislature additionally finds that scientific evidence supports 16 17 a one-half mile buffer from schools and public parks to prevent

10	SECTION 2. Section 149A-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
11	amended to read as follows:	
12	"[{]§149A-27[}] Public reports; contents. The department	
13	shall produce a summary, for public disclosure, by county, that	
14	includes:	
15	(1)	The total quantities used, in a consistent unit of
16		measurement, by federal and state registrations or
17		permit numbers, commercial product names, and active
18		ingredients, for each restricted use pesticide used;
19		and
20	(2)	The amount of area in the county in which the
21		restricted use application occurred."



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1 SECTION 3. Section 149A-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2 "[+] \$149A-28[+] Buffer zones. Beginning January 1, 3 [2019,] 2025, no person shall apply a restricted use pesticide 4 on or within [one-hundred-feet] one-half mile of a school 5 property during normal school hours [;] or a state or county 6 public park; provided that this section shall not apply to whole 7 structure fumigation; provided further that if this section is 8 determined to conflict with any pesticide application 9 information listed on the pesticide label, the more restrictive 10 provision shall apply." 11 12 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 15
