A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pesticide exposure
- 2 can cause significant harm to public health and the environment.
- 3 Restricted use pesticides have been deemed to have high
- 4 potential to cause harm to surrounding communities, farm
- 5 workers, pollinators, the environment, and other crops.
- 6 Comprehensive pesticide use data is therefore essential to
- 7 accurately assess risks and ensure that communities are
- 8 protected from adverse impacts.
- 9 The legislature further finds that Act 45, Session Laws of
- 10 Hawaii 2018, established requirements intended to address
- 11 pesticide abuse in Hawaii, including requiring all users of
- 12 restricted use pesticides to annually report on their use of
- 13 restricted use pesticides to the department of agriculture.
- 14 However, robust and meaningful analysis of environmental and
- 15 public health impacts of pesticides is contingent on more
- 16 comprehensive reporting.

1 The legislature also finds that currently, pesticide users 2 are required to report the address, tax map key, and location of 3 the application site but are not required to provide specific 4 geospatial data that could provide comprehensive mapping of 5 pesticide impacts. This poses difficulties to communities who 6 live adjacent to large tracts of agricultural land. According to the state-sponsored Joint Fact Finding Group study, Pesticide 7 8 Use by Large Agribusinesses on Kaua'i (2016), "more information is needed about the time and place of applications along with 9 10 greater oversight to ensure compliance on all Islands. Again, 11 California appears to lead the nation in studies of chronic **12** health effects and/or associations with pesticide use. They are 13 able to reach this level of scientific inquiry because they 14 require careful reporting of pesticide applications that specify 15 what was sprayed, where, when, and in what quantities." 16 Improved reporting in Hawaii can provide policymakers and public 17 health experts with important data with which to make evidence-18 based decisions about pesticide use. 19 The purpose of this Act is to protect the health of 20 Hawaii's environment and people and enable more informed public

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- 1 health decision—making through improving reporting requirements
- 2 for restricted use pesticides by:
- 3 (1) Requiring quarterly rather than annual reporting of 4 all use of restricted use pesticides;
- 5 (2) Amending the contents of the reports to include 6 detailed geospatial information and increased detail 7 and uniformity regarding the amount of product and 8 chemicals applied; and
- 9 (3) Requiring the department of agriculture to develop an10 online reporting tool for restricted use pesticides.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 149A-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows:
- "[[+] \$149A-26[+] Post-application reporting of pesticide
- 14 use. (a) [Beginning January 1, 2019, every] Every user of
- 15 restricted use pesticides shall be subject to the requirement to
- 16 submit to the department, for departmental use, [an annual] \underline{a}
- 17 quarterly report of all use of restricted use pesticides as
- 18 provided in this section.
- 19 (b) No later than thirty days following the end of each
- 20 calendar [year, quarter, every entity that uses restricted use
- 21 pesticides shall provide to the department a report of all

3	(c)	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
4	91 requir	ing that the [annual] quarterly reports include the
5	following	information:
6	(1)	A listing, by federal and state registrations or

8		ingredients, of all restricted use pesticides used;
9	(2)	The total quantities used for each restricted use
10		pesticide[+], listed by type in pounds of active
11		ingredient applied and percentage of active ingredient
12		found in any restricted use pesticide applied;
13	(3)	A [general] detailed description of the geographic
14		location, including, at a minimum[, the]:
15		(A) Geospatial data and information up to an area of
16		one square mile; and
17		(B) The tax map key number, at which the restricted
18		use pesticides were used; and
19	(4)	The date on which the restricted use pesticide
20		application occurred."

19	online re	porting tool for restricted use pesticide reporting
20	pursuant	to section 149A-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- 1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2040.

Report Title:

DOA; Pesticides; Restricted Use; Geospatial Data; Reports; Online Reporting Tool

Description:

Requires quarterly rather than annual reporting of all use of restricted use pesticides. Amends the contents of reports to include specific geospatial data and information and increased detail on the amount of restricted use pesticides used. Requires the Department of Agriculture to develop an online reporting tool for restricted use pesticides. Takes effect 7/1/2040. (SD1)

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
