A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RIGHT TO GARDEN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that the 2023 Maui 1 SECTION 1. 2 wildfires interrupted food supply chains for the island. The 3 legislature notes that growing one's own food is a fundamental 4 right under the First and Fourteenth Amendments to the United 5 States Constitution and sections 4, 5, and 21 of article I of 6 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii. The legislature 7 believes that authorizing residents to grow their own food will 8 increase Hawaii's resident population and food resiliency while 9 mitigating the negative effects of future catastrophic events.

10 The legislature also finds that, according to the Lahaina Wildfire interim Working Group, as "a geographically isolated 11 12 state with a limited local food supply and reliance upon imports 13 . . . , Hawai'i is particularly susceptible to food insecurity following a disaster event." The working group recommended 14 that, because disaster events may lead to an increased reliance 15 16 on food assistance programs and the severity of food insecurity, 17 statutorily authorizing home gardens will improve Hawaii's food



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1	security. Nevertheless, many homeowners' associations and			
2	associations of apartment owners prohibit or severely restrict			
3	resident gardening practices.			
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the			
5	cultivation of vegetable gardens on properties within			
6	condominiums and planned community associations.			
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 514B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
9	and to read as follows:			
10	" <u>§514B- Right to garden. (a) Notwithstanding any law</u>			
11	to the contrary, no provision in any articles of incorporation,			
12	declaration, bylaws, administrative rules, house rules, or			
13	association documents of a condominium shall prohibit any person			
14	from cultivating, or restrict any person's ability to cultivate,			
15	one or more vegetable gardens within a unit that is rented,			
16	owned, or leased by the person under this chapter; provided			
17	that:			
18	(1) No person shall cultivate any vegetable garden in a			
19	unit that is owned by another without the consent of			
20	the unit owner; provided further that the unit owner			
21	may withdraw this consent at any time;			



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1	(2)	No vegetable garden shall:	
2		(A) Be cultivated in a common element; or	
3		(B) Abut any building in the condominium; and	
4	(3)	If the unit is owned by another, the unit owner may	
5		impose restrictions on water use and the types of	
6		plants to be cultivated, including prohibiting	
7		invasive or destructive plants.	
8	(b)	Nothing in this section shall be construed as	
9	prohibiti	ng the enactment of a county ordinance or regulation	
10	addressin	g water use during droughts, fertilizer use, or the	
11	<u>control o</u>	f invasive species."	
12	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 421J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
14	and to re	ad as follows:	
15	" <u>§</u> 42	1J- Right to garden. (a) Notwithstanding any law	
16	to the co	ntrary, no provision in any association documents shall	
17	prohibit	any person from cultivating, or restrict any person's	
18	ability to cultivate, one or more vegetable gardens within a		
19	unit that is rented, owned, or leased by the person under this		
20	chapter;	provided that:	



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1	(1)	No person shall cultivate any vegetable garden in a
2		unit that is owned by another without the consent of
3		the unit owner; provided further that the unit owner

5	(2)	No vegetable garden shall:
6		(A) Be cultivated in a common area; or
7		(B) Abut any building in the planned community; and
8	(3)	If the unit is owned by another, the unit owner may
9		impose restrictions on water use and the types of
10		plants to be cultivated, including prohibiting
11		invasive or destructive plants.
12	<u>(b)</u>	Nothing in this section shall be construed as
13	prohibiti	ng the enactment of a county ordinance or regulation
