A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the existing
- 2 statutory prohibition on tobacco in public schools may be
- 3 narrowly construed to not account for the growing sector of new
- electronic smoking devices that deliver nicotine to youth.
- 5 While the United States Food and Drug Administration has
- classified vapes and electronic cigarettes as tobacco products,
- 7 the existing statutory prohibition is vague as to whether the
- 8 prohibition extends to such devices. Additionally, the existing
- statutory prohibition on tobacco in public schools extends only 9
- 10 to the use of tobacco, not the possession. This oversight
- allows students to be in possession of tobacco without being in 11
- 12 violation of the existing statutory prohibition.
- 13 The legislature further finds that in October 2022, the
- 14 annual Hawaii children and youth summit convened children from
- 15 across the State to help prioritize issues for Hawaii's youth.
- 16 Through their discussion, the children highlighted the need to
- 17 create middle and high school programs with peer-to-peer



•	support,	establish therapy and counseling services that	
2	emphasize	the consequences of smoking, and increase awareness	
3	about hea	lth education in schools.	
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:		
5	(1)	Update and expand the statutory prohibition on the use	
6		of tobacco at public schools to include prohibiting	
7		the possession and use of electronic smoking devices;	
8		and	
9	(2)	Require the department of education to be responsible	
10		for educating students, employees, and visitors about	
11		the smoking and tobacco use prohibitions.	
12	SECTION 2. Section 302A-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended to read as follows:		
14	"§302A-102 [Smoking] Tobacco products and electronic		
15	smoking d	evices prohibited. (a) All public schools within the	
16	State, from kindergarten through grade twelve, shall prohibit		
17	the possession and use of tobacco products and electronic		
18	smoking devices at public schools or at public school functions		
19	(b)	The department shall be responsible for educating	
20	etudente	employees and visitors about the emoking and tobacco

3	(1)	Be prominently displayed at all entrances to the
4		premises and at other conspicuous outdoor locations
5		throughout the premises; and
6	(2)	State that smoking, including the use of electronic
7		smoking devices, electronic nicotine delivery systems,
8		and tobacco use, are prohibited by law.
9	<u>(c)</u>	For the purposes of this section:
10	<u>"Cig</u>	arette" has the same meaning as in section 486P-1.
11	<u>"Ele</u>	ctronic nicotine delivery system":
12	<u>(1)</u>	Means any electronic device that, through an
13		aerosolized solution, delivers nicotine, flavor, or
14		any other substance to the user inhaling from the
15		device;
16	(2)	Includes:
17		(A) An e-cigarette;
18		(B) An e-hookah;
19		(C) An e-cigar;
20		(D) A vape pen;
21		(E) An advanced refillable personal vaporizer;

1	<u>(F)</u>	An electronic pipe; and			
2	<u>(G)</u>	Any component, liquid, part, or accessory of a			
3		device described in paragraph (1), without regard			
4		to whether the component, liquid, part, or			
5		accessory is sold separately from the device; and			
6	(3) Does	not include a product that is:			
7	<u>(A)</u>	Approved by the United States Food and Drug			
8		Administration for:			
9		(i) Sale as a tobacco cessation product; or			
10	-	(ii) Any other therapeutic purpose; and			
11	<u>(B)</u>	Marketed and sold solely for a purpose described			
12		in subparagraph (A).			
13	"Electron	ic smoking device" has the same meaning as in			
14	section 304A-122.				
15	"Premises"	" means all indoor and outdoor areas within			
16	property owned	or controlled by the department or for which the			
17	department is	otherwise responsible.			
18	"Smoke" o	r "smoking" has the same meaning as in section			
19	304A-122.				
20	"Tobacco]	product" has the same meaning as in section 712-			
21	1258
