## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 134C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending its title to read as follows:
3	"OFFICE OF GUN VIOLENCE [AND VIOLENT CRIMES COMMISSION]
4	PREVENTION"
5	SECTION 2. Section 134C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[ <del>[</del> ]§134C-1[ <del>] Gun</del> ] <u>Office of gun</u> violence [ <del>and violent</del>
8	crimes commission;] prevention; established. (a) There is
9	established the office of gun violence [and violent crimes
10	commission] prevention that shall be placed within the
11	department of the attorney general for administrative purposes
12	only.
13	(b) The administrative head of the office shall be a
14	director, who shall be nominated and appointed by the governor.
15	The office shall employ analysts, grant writers, and other staff
16	necessary for the purposes of the office."

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1	SECTION 3. Section 134C-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[ <del>[</del> ]§134C-3[ <del>] Gun</del> ] <u>Office of gun</u> violence [ <del>and violent</del>
4	crimes commission;] prevention; powers and duties. (a) The
5	purpose of the <u>office of</u> gun violence [ <del>and violent crimes</del>
6	commission] prevention shall be to develop comprehensive
7	strategies to prevent and address various types of gun violence
8	[ <del>and violent crimes</del> ] in Hawaii[+] <u>, including suicide, mass</u>
9	shootings, and surges in other forms of gun violence.
10	(b) The [ <del>gun violence and violent crimes commission shall</del>
11	provide coordination, facilitation, and planning among] office
12	may coordinate with state and county agencies, federal agencies,
13	and other partners as appropriate to carry out its purpose.
14	(c) The [gun-violence and violent crimes commission shall
15	endeavor to:] office may:
16	(1) [ <del>Identify</del> ] <u>Collect</u> relevant data that may be used to
17	reduce gun violence [and violent crimes];
18	(2) Access relevant data from law enforcement agencies and
19	other governmental entities; provided that the office

4		available;

7		of data relevant to reducing gun violence and violent
8		crimes;] and
9	(4)	[Coordinate and conduct research on gun violence and
10		violent crimes.] Analyze relevant data, and build and
11		maintain the capacity for that analysis.
12	(d)	The [gun violence and violent crimes commission]
13	office may	y work with and engage stakeholders for the purposes of
14	this chap	ter.
15	(e)	The [gun violence and violent crimes commission shall
16	<pre>submit a]</pre>	office may report [ <del>of</del> ] its findings and
17	recommenda	ations, including any proposed legislation, to the
18	legislatu	re [ <del>no later than forty days prior to the convening of</del>
19	the regula	ar session of 2022 and each regular session

3	SECTION 4. Section 134C-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	repealed.
5	[" <del>§134C-2 Gun violence and violent crimes commission;</del>
6	membership. (a) The attorney general or the attorney general's
7	designee shall coordinate and serve as the chair of the gun
8	violence and violent crimes commission.
9	(b) The following individuals, or their designees, shall
10	serve as members of the gun violence and violent crimes
11	commission:
12	(1) The chief justice of the supreme court of Hawaii;
13	(2) The director of health;
14	(3) The director of law enforcement;
15	(4) A county prosecuting attorney to be selected by the
16	chair of the commission;
17	(5) The public defender;
18	(6) The chief of police of each county;
19	(7) The administrator of the Hawaii state hospital;
20	(8) The dean of the college of social sciences at the
21	University of Hawaii at Manoa;

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1	(9) The dean of the John A. Burns-school of medicine;
2	(10) One representative from a group that advocates for
3	stricter gun safety laws; and
4	(11) One representative from a firearm advocacy group.
5	(c) The chair of the gun violence and violent crimes
6	commission may request the participation or input of experts in
7	gun violence and violent crimes; county, state, and federal
8	officials; members of the public; and other persons as
9	necessary.
10	(d) The members of the gun violence and violent crimes
11	commission shall serve without compensation but may be
12	reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses, including
13	travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their duties."]
14	SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
15	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
16	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
17	that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
18	state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
19	to be exceeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons
20	for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the

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1	appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
2	interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.
3	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
6	the office of gun violence prevention for:
7	(1) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) director;
8	(2) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) grant writer
9	position;
10	(3) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) analyst position;
11	and
12	(4) Operating costs and equipment, including equipment
13	necessary for analyzing relevant data relating to gun
14	violence.
15	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
16	the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
17	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2042.
