# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SERVICE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I		
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is		
3	responsible for upholding an ethical position on the deterrence		
4	of conflicts of interest, bribery, and corruption in all		
5	branches of government. When government is idle about		
6	combatting corruption, this can erode public trust and		
7	confidence for state leaders and exacerbate social tensions,		
8	which could contribute to violence.		
9	The purpose of this Act is to:		
10	(1) Require that certain judicial appointees file the same		
11	financial disclosures that are required of other state		
12	officials, which will help prevent bribery and		
13	corruption; and		
14	(2) Require the commission on salaries to consider the		
15	deterrence of bribery and corruption when making its		
16	salary recommendations.		

1	PART II		
2	SECTION 2. Section 84-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
4	and to read as follows:		
5	""Appointee for a judge or justice" means a person selected		
6	by the governor, chief justice, or judicial selection commission		
7	from the list presented by the judicial selection commission		
8	under article VI, section 3, of the Hawaii State Constitution;		
9	provided that an "appointee for a judge or justice" shall not		
10	include a person who is appointed as a per diem district court		
11	judge by the chief justice."		
12	SECTION 3. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:		
14	"(b) The disclosure of financial interests required by		
15	this section shall be filed:		
16	(1) By any person enumerated in subsection (c), except $\underline{an}$		
17	appointee for a judge or justice or a member of the		
18	legislature, between January 1 and May 31 of each		
19	year;		
20	(2) By an appointee for a judge or justice within five		
21	business days of the appointee's appointment; provided		

1		that the disclosure shall be made available to the
2		senate in addition to the state ethics commission and
3		made public by the state ethics commission;
4	[ <del>(2)</del> ]	(3) By a member of the legislature between January 1
5		and January 31 of each year;
6	[ <del>-(3)</del> -]	(4) Within thirty days of a person's election or
7		appointment to a state position enumerated in
8		subsection (c); or
9	[-(4)-]	(5) Within thirty days of separation from a state
10		position if a prior financial disclosure statement for
11		the position was not filed within the one hundred
12		eighty days preceding the date of separation;
13	provided -	that candidates for state elective offices or the
14	constitut	ional convention shall file the required statements no
15	later than	n ten days after the nomination filing deadline
16	establish	ed pursuant to section 12-6.
17	(c)	The following persons shall file annually with the
18	state eth:	ics commission a disclosure of financial interests:
19	(1)	The governor, lieutenant governor, members of the
20		legislature, and delegates to the constitutional
21		convention; provided that delegates to the

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	constitutional convention shall only be required to
	file initial disclosures;
(2)	The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,
	the executive directors and the executive secretaries
	and their deputies, the purchasing agents, and the
	fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the
	foregoing persons are designated, of every state

(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
	service agencies, other than persons employed in
	clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
	assistants in the office of the governor and
	lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
	clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
	department;
(6)	The president, vice presidents, assistant vice
	presidents, chancellors, and provosts of the
	[ <del>University</del> ] university of Hawaii and its community
	colleges;

2		superintendents, complex area superintendents, state
3		librarian, and deputy state librarian of the
4		department of education;
5	(8)	The administrative director and deputy director of the

8		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
9		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;
10	(10)	Candidates for state elective offices, including
11		candidates for election to the constitutional
12		convention[;], and appointees for justices and judges;
13		provided that candidates and appointees shall only be
14		required to file initial disclosures;
15	(11)	The administrator and assistant administrator of the
16		office of Hawaiian affairs;
17	(12)	The Hawaii unmanned aerial systems test site chief
18		operating officer; and
19	(13)	The members of the school facilities board appointed
20		by the governor."

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         SECTION 4. Section 26-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

- 5 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 7 begun before its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000;
- 11 provided that the amendments made to section 84-17, Hawaii
- 12 Revised Statutes, by section 3 of this Act shall not be repealed
- 13 when that section is amended on January 1, 2025, pursuant to Act
- 14 123, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023.

### Report Title:

Public Officials; Judicial Appointees; Ethics; Salaries; Disclosures

#### Description:

Requires appointees for judicial vacancies to file certain disclosures with the State Ethics Commission, under certain conditions. Requires the Commission on Salaries to consider the deterrence of bribery and corruption when making its salary recommendations. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
