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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE  
SIXTH SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
3 general obligation reimbursable bonds in the sum of \$70,000,000  
4 or so much thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so  
5 much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year  
6 2024-2025 for the purpose of the following capital improvement  
7 project for the sixth senatorial district:

8 1. Lahaina Bypass Road, Maui

9 A. Plans, land acquisition, design,  
10 construction, and equipment for an  
11 extension of the Lahaina bypass  
12 road from North Keawe street to  
13 beyond Puukolii road.

4 SECTION 2. The sum appropriated for the capital  
5 improvement project shall be expended by the department of  
6 transportation for the purposes of this part.

8 SECTION 3. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
9 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$62,500,000 or so much  
10 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof  
11 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2024-2025  
12 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the sixth  
13 senatorial district, as follows:

14 1. Kulanihakoi High School

15 A. Plans, land acquisition, design,  
16 construction, and equipment for an  
17 ADA-compliant grade-separated  
18 crossing.

1 SECTION 4. The sums appropriated for the respective  
 2 capital projects set forth in section 3 shall be expended by the  
 3 department of education for the purposes of this part.

4 PART III

5 SECTION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
 6 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$18,674,000 or so much  
 7 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof  
 8 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2024-2025  
 9 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the sixth  
 10 senatorial district as follows:

11 1. Mala Boat Ramp

12 A. Design and construction for  
 13 maintenance dredging, including  
 14 dredging of accumulated material  
 15 at boat ramp and entrance channel  
 16 and movement of dredged material  
 17 for upland unrestricted use.

1 SECTION 7. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
 2 general obligation reimbursable bonds in the sum of \$3,200,000  
 3 or so much thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so  
 4 much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year  
 5 2024-2025 for the purpose of the following capital improvement  
 6 project for the sixth senatorial district:

7 1. Axis Deer Fencing, Maui

8 A. Construction for fencing of  
 9 property to prevent the migration  
 10 of axis deer in Kihei.

11 Construction \$3,200,000

12 Total funding \$3,200,000

13 SECTION 8. The sum appropriated for the respective capital  
 14 project set forth in section 7 shall be expended by the  
 15 department of health for the purposes of this part.

16 PART V

17 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of federal moneys  
 18 received by the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000,000 or so  
 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for  
 20 plans, design, construction, and equipment for an R-1 water  
 21 reservoir.



1           The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
2 health for the purposes of this part.

3           SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general  
4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,500,000 or so much  
5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for plans,  
6 design, construction, and equipment for an R-1 water reservoir.

7           The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
8 health for the purposes of this part; provided that no moneys  
9 appropriated by this section shall be expended unless the county  
10 of Maui provides matching moneys on a dollar-for-dollar basis.

11           SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of federal moneys  
12 received by the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much  
13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the  
14 rehabilitation of Kulanihakoi stream, including installation of  
15 irrigation from the R-1 water reservoir and planting of  
16 vegetation to trap sediment.

17           The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
18 health for the purposes of this part.

19           SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of federal moneys  
20 received by the State of Hawaii the sum of \$130,000 or so much  
21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the



1 rehabilitation of Waipuilani stream, including installation of  
2 irrigation from the R-1 water reservoir and planting of  
3 vegetation to trap sediment.

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the clean water  
5 branch of the department of health for the purposes of this  
6 part.

7 PART VI

8 SECTION 13. The appropriations made by this Act shall not  
9 lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation  
10 is made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation  
11 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

12 SECTION 14. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of  
13 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,  
14 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the  
15 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,  
16 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure  
17 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by  
18 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes  
19 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal  
20 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act



1 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure  
2 ceiling are that:


3 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to  
4 serve the public interest; and

5 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs  
6 addressed by this Act.

7 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

**Report Title:**

CIP; 6th Senatorial District; DOT; DOE; DLNR; DOH; Expenditure Ceiling; Appropriations

**Description:**

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 6th senatorial district, including extension of the Lahaina bypass road by the Department of Transportation; projects for Department of Education schools; projects for Department of Land and Natural Resources boating facilities; and R-1 water projects for the Clean Water Branch of the Department of Health. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes appropriations.
