A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is great
3	demand for high quality mental health practitioners in the
4	State, particularly in the aftermath of the coronavirus disease
5	2019. The purpose of this Act is to expand access to high
6	quality mental health services by:
7	(1) Establishing provisional or associate-level licensure
8	requirements and reimbursement allowances for certain
9	mental health practitioners in training; and
10	(2) Allowing psychologist license applicants to sit for
11	the licensing examination before completing other
12	requirements.
13	PART II
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 451J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
16	and to read as follows:

- 4 (d) Services provided by a supervised licensed associate

4		not limited to the study of issues and trends in

9		disability, ethnicity and culture, gender,
10		socioeconomics, intellectual ability, and
11		individual, family, and group strategies with
12		diverse populations;
13	(C)	Counseling theories and applications, including
14		but not limited to counseling and consultation,
15		including both individual and systems
16		perspectives; interviewing; assessment; and
17		counseling skills; as well as applying
18		principles, methods, and theories of counseling,
19		treatment and counseling of mental and emotional
20		disorders, and educational techniques aimed at

1		preventing these disorders with individuals and
2		<pre>families;</pre>
3	<u>(D)</u>	Group theory and practice, including but not
4		limited to principles of group dynamics, group
5		process, group leadership styles, theories and
6		methods of group counseling, and the application
7		of theory to the group processes;
8	(E)	Career and lifestyle development, including but
9		not limited to the study of vocational
10		development theories and decision-making models;
11		assessment instruments; and techniques, types,
12		sources, and uses of occupational and educational
13		information systems, career development
14		applications, and career counseling processes,
15		techniques, and resources;
16	(F)	Appraisal of human behavior, including but not
17		limited to assessment and diagnosis of disorders
18		with an emphasis on DSM categories and an
19		understanding of these disorders relative to the
20		counseling context;

1	<u>(G)</u>	Tests and measurements, including but not limited
2		to theoretical and historical bases for
3		assessment techniques, and assessment methods,
4		including analysis of various types of tests to
5		select, administer, interpret, and use assessment
6		and evaluation instruments and techniques in

8	<u>(H)</u>	Research and program evaluation, including but
9		not limited to research design and methods,
10		statistical analysis, principles, practices, and
11		application of needs assessment and program
12		<pre>evaluation;</pre>
13	<u>(I)</u>	Professional orientation and ethics, including
14		but not limited to the history of the helping
15		profession, professional roles and functions,
16		ethical standards, confidentiality, professional
17		organizations, and the public policy process,
18		including advocacy on behalf of the profession
19		and its clientele; and
20	<u>(J)</u>	At least two academic terms of supervised mental
21		health practicum intern experience for graduate

1		credit of at least six semester hours or ten
