# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the role of a governmental advisory board is to provide up-to-date 2 information, critical thinking, and analysis to the decision-3 4 makers who represent the government entity that the board is advising, and that that advisory board itself does not make 5 decisions. The legislature further finds that the governor is 6 7 charged with nominating qualified individuals to state advisory 8 board and commission positions.

9 The purpose of this Act is to:

10 (1) Specify that nominated members for the statewide
11 voters with special needs advisory board are subject
12 to the advice and consent of the senate standing
13 committee on government operations;

14 (2) Specify that nominated members for the commission to
15 promote uniform legislation are subject to the advice
16 and consent of the senate standing committee on
17 government operations; and



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1 (3) Specify that nominated members for the commission on fatherhood are subject to the advice and consent of 2 3 the senate standing committee on government operations. 4 5 SECTION 2. Section 11-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 7 "(b) The advisory committee shall consist of five members 8 appointed by the governor based on recommendations from organizations within the State that are comprised of a majority 9 10 of officers and members who are persons with physical 11 disabilities, including visual impairment. Each member shall 12 identify as a voter with special needs arising from physical 13 disabilities, including visual and hearing impairments that 14 require an accommodation to vote. The terms of advisory 15 committee members shall be four years; provided that initial 16 terms shall be one, two, three, or four years to ensure 17 staggered rotation of members. The members shall be subject to 18 advice and consent of the senate standing committee on 19 government operations." SECTION 3. Section 26-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended to read as follows: 21

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"§26-7 Department of the attorney general. The department
 of the attorney general shall be headed by a single executive to
 be known as the attorney general.

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The department shall administer and render state legal 4 services, including furnishing of written legal opinions to the 5 governor, legislature, and such state departments and officers 6 7 as the governor may direct; represent the State in all civil 8 actions in which the State is a party; approve as to legality 9 and form all documents relating to the acquisition of any land 10 or interest in lands by the State; and, unless otherwise 11 provided by law, prosecute cases involving violations of state 12 laws and cases involving agreements, uniform laws, or other matters which are enforceable in the courts of the State. The 13 attorney general shall be charged with such other duties and 14 15 have such authority as heretofore provided by common law or 16 statute.

17 There shall be within the department of the attorney 18 general a commission to be known as the commission to promote 19 uniform legislation, which shall sit in an advisory capacity to 20 the attorney general and to the legislature on matters relating 21 to the promotion of uniform legislation. The composition of the

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
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1 commission shall be as heretofore provided for the commission to promote uniform legislation existing immediately prior to 2 November 25, 1959. The members of the commission shall be 3 nominated, and by and with the advice and consent of the senate 4 5 standing committee on government operations, appointed by the 6 governor for terms of four years  $each[\tau]$ ; provided that each member shall hold office until the member's successor is 7 appointed and qualified; [and] provided [also] further that the 8 9 provisions of section 26-34, limiting the appointment of members 10 of boards and commissions to two terms and the duration of 11 membership to not more than eight consecutive years shall not be 12 applicable.

13 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the 14 attorney general, high sheriff, and the commission to promote 15 uniform legislation as heretofore constituted are transferred to 16 the department of the attorney general established by this 17 chapter."

18 SECTION 4. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
20 "(a) The members of each board and commission established
21 by law shall be nominated and, by and with the advice and



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1 consent of the senate standing committee on government 2 operations, appointed by the governor. Unless otherwise provided by this chapter or by law hereafter enacted, the terms 3 4 of the members shall be for four years; provided that the governor may reduce the terms of those initially appointed so as 5 6 to provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an equal 7 number of terms at intervals of one year for each board and 8 commission. Unless otherwise provided by law, each term shall 9 commence on July 1 and expire on June 30, except that the terms 10 of the chairpersons of the board of agriculture, the board of 11 land and natural resources, and the Hawaiian homes commission 12 shall commence on January 1 and expire on December 31. No 13 person shall be appointed consecutively to more than two terms 14 as a member of the same board or commission; provided that 15 membership on any board or commission shall not exceed eight 16 consecutive years."

SECTION 5. Section 577E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended to read as follows:

19 "§577E-3 Members; terms; chair; quorum; compensation. (a)
20 The commission shall consist of fifteen members and reflect the

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geographic and cultural diversity of the State. The membership 1 2 shall include: Ex officio, the director of human services, 3 (1)superintendent of education, director of health, 4 attorney general, director of public safety, and 5 executive director of the office of youth services, or 6 7 their designees; and (2) Eight voting members who shall be appointed by the 8 9 governor as provided in section 26-34, except as 10 otherwise provided in this section, as follows: 11 Two members shall be appointed by the governor (A) 12 from a list of three nominees submitted by the 13 president of the senate, and two members shall be 14 appointed by the governor from a list of three nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of 15 16 representatives; and 17 (B) Four members shall be appointed by the governor 18 from the community. 19 (3) One voting member who shall be designated by the 20 Hawaii Coalition for Dads.

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1 (b) Of the appointed members, there shall be at least one 2 member from each of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii. 3 All members shall serve for a term of four years. Any (C) 4 vacancies occurring in the membership of the commission shall be 5 filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same 6 manner as the original appointments. No member shall serve on 7 the commission for more than two terms; provided that if a member fills a vacancy and serves for the remainder of an 8 9 unexpired term that member shall be considered to have served 10 one term.

(d) The chair and vice chair of the board shall be selected annually from the nongovernmental members of the commission appointed pursuant to subsection (a)(2). A simple majority shall constitute a quorum, whose affirmative vote shall be necessary for all actions.

16 (e) The members shall serve without compensation.
17 (f) Any member of the commission shall be immune from
18 civil liability as provided in section 26-35.5.

(g) The members shall be subject to advice and consent of
 the senate standing committee on government operations."

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SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
