### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1)	Require the department of human services to collect
3		and analyze data to determine the impact of expanding
4		post-permanency services to families receiving
5		benefits from the adoption assistance program and
6		report its findings and recommendation to the
7		legislature before the convening of the regular
8		session of 2025; and
9	(2)	Appropriate funds to the department of human services
10		for the procurement of contracted services to provide
11		additional support, resources, and monitoring of
12		families receiving benefits from the State's adoption
13		assistance program for the purposes of assisting with
14		family strengthening and the maintenance of a safe
15		home environment for adopted children.
16	SECTION 2. The department of human services shall collect	
17	and analyze data to determine the impact of expanding	

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1 post-permanency services to families receiving benefits from the 2 adoption assistance program and shall submit a report of its 3 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 4 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 5 to the convening of the regular session of 2025.

6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 10 year 2024-2025 for the procurement of contracted services to provide additional support, resources, and monitoring of 11 families receiving benefits from the State's adoption assistance 12 13 program for the purposes of assisting with family strengthening 14 and the maintenance of a safe home environment for adopted children. 15

16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 17 of human services for the purposes of this Act; provided that: 18 (1) \$ shall be expended for the development and 19 maintenance of necessary information technology 20 systems, including the establishment of full 21 time equivalent (FTE) positions;



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1 (2) shall be expended to increase compensation \$ to fill vacancies and retain employees in existing 2 3 child welfare services branch investigator, case 4 manager, and social worker positions; provided that 5 any increase in compensation shall be subject to 6 collective bargaining with the objective of 7 expeditiously filling all vacancies; 8 (3) shall be expended for the department of \$ 9 human services to contract with a third-party for 10 enhanced permanency support services, including 11 additional training for resource caregivers, wellness visits within a year of adoption or guardianship of 12 children formerly in foster care, respite care, and 13 14 enhanced supportive services to assist with family strengthening and maintenance of a safe home 15 environment for adopted children; and 16 17 shall be expended for the establishment of (4) \$ 18 one full time equivalent (1.0 FTE) planner or project specialist position to administer and monitor 19 20 additional service contracts and assist with

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additional service coordination, data collection, and
analysis of the new program.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
2050; provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on
July 1, 2023.
