A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that candidates for
- 2 elected office, including incumbents, sometimes promote their
- 3 candidacies by attending events held by nonprofit organizations.
- 4 The candidates are often invited to speak or appear before
- 5 attendees, increasing the visibility of the candidates and their
- 6 campaigns among voters and contributors. Candidates may also
- 7 mingle among attendees to solicit votes or to discuss their
- 8 experiences as incumbents.
- **9** Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize any
- 10 candidate committee, under certain circumstances, to expend
- 11 campaign funds to purchase a ticket for a candidate to attend an
- 12 event held by a nonprofit organization.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 14 by adding a new section to part XIII, subpart G, to be
- 15 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 16 "\$11- Candidate appearances; nonprofit organizations;
- 17 events; tickets. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a



1	candidate committee may expend campaign funds to purchase a
2	ticket for the committee's candidate to attend any event hosted
3	by a nonprofit organization, regardless of whether the event
4	occurs during an election year; provided that at the event, the
5	candidate attempts to:
6	(1) Promote or solicit funds for the candidate's election
7	campaign; or
8	(2) Communicate to attendees about matters related to the
9	office the candidate holds as an incumbent."
10	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
