A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a sustainable food
 system is one in which producers, retailers, members of the
 community, non-governmental organizations, and government
 agencies partner to create a vibrant and resilient local food
 economy that enhances and sustains the environmental, economic,
 and social health of the community.

7 The legislature further finds that developing a more 8 sustainable food system for Hawaii represents an opportunity to 9 create a new food economy that integrates the objectives of 10 "green" job creation, sustainable economic development, land stewardship, food security, environmental protection, and 11 12 climate change resiliency with community health and well-being. 13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within 14 the department of agriculture the sustainable food systems 15 working group to develop an interagency food systems plan. 16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department 17 of agriculture the sustainable food systems working group. The



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working group shall identify a governance structure and
 implementation plan for an interagency food systems plan linked
 to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals for a more
 sustainable, resilient local food economy that enhances and
 sustains the environmental, economic, and social health of the
 community.

7 (b) The sustainable food systems working group shall be8 composed of the following members:

9 (1) One member of the house of representatives, to be10 selected by the speaker of the house of

11 representatives;

12 (2) One member of the senate, to be selected by the13 president of the senate;

14 (3) A representative of the Hawaii tourism authority, to
15 be selected by the president and chief executive
16 officer of the Hawaii tourism authority;

17 (4) Two representatives of the University of Hawaii system
18 who have experience in food systems, to be selected by
19 the chairperson of the board of agriculture;

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1	(5)	A representative of the department of agriculture, to
2		be selected by the chairperson of the board of
3		agriculture;
4	(6)	A representative of the office of Hawaiian affairs, to
5		be selected by the chairperson of the board of
6		trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs;
7	(7)	A representative of the office of climate change,
8		sustainability and resiliency of the city and county
9		of Honolulu, to be selected by the chief resilience
10		officer and executive director of the office of
11		climate change, sustainability and resiliency of the
12		city and county of Honolulu;
13	(8)	The food access coordinators of the city and county of
14		Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai;
15	(9)	A representative of the department of Native Hawaiian
16		health of the John A. Burns school of medicine of the
17		University of Hawaii, to be selected by the chair of
18		the department of Native Hawaiian health;
19	(10)	Two persons with familiarity, experience, or expertise
20		in the Native Hawaiian community, to be selected by
21		the chairperson of the board of agriculture; provided

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1		that one of the members shall be a resident of a
2		county other than the city and county of Honolulu;
3	(11)	A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau, to be
4		selected by the executive director of the Hawaii Farm
5		Bureau;
6	(12)	A representative of the Hawaii Foodbank, to be
7		selected by the president and chief executive officer
8		of the Hawaii Foodbank;
9	(13)	A representative of the agricultural sector, to be
10		selected by the chairperson of the board of
11		agriculture;
12	(14)	Four farmers, with each farmer representing one of the
13		counties of Hawaii, Kauai, or Maui, or the city and
14		county of Honolulu, to be selected by the chairperson
15		of the board of agriculture;
16	(15)	Four representatives of the agricultural sector, of
17		which each member shall represent one of the counties
18		of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, or the city and county of
19		Honolulu, to be selected by the respective mayor of
20		each county;

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1	(16)	A representative of the farm-to-school community in
2		Hawaii, to be selected by the chairperson of the board
3		of agriculture;
4	(17)	A representative of the Hawaii Foodservice Alliance,
5		to be selected by the owner of the Hawaii Foodservice
6		Alliance;
7	(18)	A representative of the Hawaii Food Industry
8		Association, to be selected by the executive director
9		of the Hawaii Food Industry Association;
10	(19)	A representative of the Hawaii Farmers Union United;
11	(20)	A representative of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance
12		for Conservation and Tradition, to be selected by the
13		president of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance for
14		Conservation and Tradition; and
15	(21)	A representative of the commercial fishing sector of
16		the State, to be selected by the administrator of the
17		department of land and natural resources division of
18		aquatic resources.
19	(C)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall
20	serve as	chair of the sustainable food systems working group.
21	(d)	The interagency food systems plan shall:

2		(A)	Food as a human right and healthy food for all;	
3		(B)	Social equity and food justice;	
4		(C)	Food system resilience;	
5		(D)	Agriculture and food system sustainability;	
6		(E)	Food at the center of a circular economy;	
7		(F)	Sustainable education, workforce development, and	
8			fair labor; and	
9		(G)	Good food governance; and	
10	(2)	Inco	rporate the county food access plans.	
11	(e)	The	sustainable food systems working group shall	
12	submit it:	s pla	n and any recommendations for implementation of	
13	the plan,	incl	uding any proposed legislation, to the legislature	
14	no later	than	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular	
15	session of 2025.			
16	(f)	The	department of agriculture shall provide any	
17	necessary	staf	f support, including for the preparation of the	
18	plan iden	tifie	d in subsection (a), to the sustainable food	
19	systems we	orkin	g group.	
20	(g)	The	sustainable food systems working group shall be	

21 dissolved on June 30, 2025.

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1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 3 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 4 year 2024-2025 for the purpose of establishing the sustainable 5 food systems working group and implementing section 2 of this 6 7 Act, including coordinating stakeholder meetings; managing 8 public meetings and website data management in accordance with 9 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes; writing and printing the 10 plan; and potentially obtaining services on a fee. 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 12 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 13 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 17 year 2024-2025 for full-time equivalent (FTE) sustainability specialist position in the department of 18 19 agriculture.

20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department21 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
