# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a severe
shortage of mental health providers in the State. This shortage
is due to a lack of appropriately qualified individuals and high
rates of turnover in the field, which is exacerbated by
compassion fatigue, burnout, and inadequate preparation for
mental health serving positions.

The legislature further finds that Windward community 7 8 college, in collaboration with the Hawaii state hospital, has 9 developed a mental health technician certificate of competence 10 program. The coursework for the certificate of competence 11 program addresses the immediate and critical workforce needs of 12 preparing potential employees and upskilling existing employees. 13 These certificates are also a foundation to increasingly higher 14 qualifications, as the initial certificate of competence opens a 15 pathway to further training and development. A one-year 16 certificate program currently under development will build on 17 the skills developed by the existing mental health technician



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certificate of competence program by adding clinical skills and
knowledge necessary to perform higher job requirements in more
advanced clinical settings. The coursework can also be applied
toward baccalaureate degrees. These programs help to grow the
State's overall capacity to address the mental health challenges
and needs of Hawaii's residents.

7 The mental health technician certificate of competence 8 program consists of three approved courses, which provide a 9 basic foundation in mental health knowledge in a short-term, 10 focused program of study available in person and online. The 11 asynchronous online courses can be offered to mental health 12 workers and students across the State, with Windward community 13 college coordinating with other community colleges in the 14 University of Hawaii system. However, in order for the program to be offered statewide, additional resources are needed to 15 16 provide for key personnel and to establish a scholarship program 17 to increase access to the mental health technician certificate 18 of competence program for individuals who are unemployed, 19 underemployed, or low-wage earners and others interested in 20 pursuing a career pathway in mental health.

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The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
University of Hawaii to expand and support the mental health
technician certificate of competence program.

4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to 7 support and expand the mental health technician certificate of competence program through the hiring of one full-time 8 9 equivalent (1.0 FTE) mental health technician certificate of 10 competence program coordinator, establishment of a scholarship program and granting of scholarships, and defrayal of any other 11 12 necessary administrative costs.

13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of14 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
