## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that restricting the 2 interisland transportation of cannabis by patients for their 3 personal medical use is contrary to the intent of Hawaii laws that authorize qualifying patients to use medical cannabis. 4 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to protect the 6 rights of qualifying patients to use medical cannabis by 7 specifically authorizing the interisland transportation of 8 cannabis for personal medical use; provided that no individual 9 or entity shall be required to violate federal law. SECTION 2. Section 329-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows: 12 "(f) For the purposes of this section, "transport" means 13 the transportation of cannabis, usable cannabis, or any

14 manufactured cannabis product between:

15 (1) A qualifying patient and the qualifying patient's16 primary caregiver;

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1	(2)	A qualifying out-of-state patient under eighteen years
2		of age and the caregiver of a qualifying out-of-state
3		patient;
4	(3)	The production centers and the retail dispensing
5		locations under a dispensary licensee's license;
6	(4)	Dispensaries, to the extent authorized by section
7		329D-6(r); or
8	(5)	A production center, retail dispensing location,
9		qualifying patient, primary caregiver, qualifying out-
10	· .	of-state patient, or caregiver of a qualifying out-of-
11		state patient and a certified laboratory for the
12		purpose of laboratory testing; provided that a
13		qualifying patient, primary caregiver, qualifying out-
14		of-state patient, or caregiver of a qualifying out-of-
15		state patient may only transport up to one gram of
16		cannabis per test to a certified laboratory for
17		laboratory testing and may only transport the product
18		if the qualifying patient, primary caregiver,
19		qualifying out-of-state patient, or caregiver of a
20		qualifying out-of-state patient:

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1	(A)	Secures an appointment for testing at a certified	
2		laboratory;	
3	(B)	Obtains confirmation, which may be electronic,	
4		that includes the specific time and date of the	
5		appointment and a detailed description of the	
6		product and amount to be transported to the	
7		certified laboratory for the appointment; and	
8	(C)	Has the confirmation, which may be electronic,	
9		available during transport.	
10	For purpo	ses of interisland transportation, "transport" of	
11	cannabis, usable cannabis, or any manufactured cannabis product,		
12	by any means i	s allowable only by a qualifying patient or	
13	qualifying out	-of-state patient for the patient's personal	
14	<u>medical use,</u> b	etween dispensaries to the extent authorized by	
15	section 329D-6	(r) [and] , or between a production center or	
16	retail dispens	ing location and a certified laboratory for the	
17	sole purpose o	f laboratory testing pursuant to section 329D-8,	
18	as permitted u	nder section 329D-6(m) and subject to section	
19	329D-6(j), <u>pro</u>	vided that no individual or entity shall be	
20	required to vi	olate federal law, and with the understanding that	
21	state law and	its protections do not apply outside of the	

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1	jurisdictional limits of the State. [ <del>Allowable transport</del>
2	pursuant to this section does not include interisland
3	transportation by any means or for any purpose between a
4	qualifying patient, primary caregiver, qualifying out of state
5	patient, or caregiver of a qualifying out of state patient and
6	any other entity or individual, including an individual who is a
7	qualifying patient, primary caregiver, qualifying out-of-state
8	patient, or caregiver of a qualifying out of-state patient.]"
9	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun before its effective date.
12	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
15	2050.
