BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	" <u>§134</u> -	Possession of a loaded firearm while intoxicated;	
5	prohibited.	(a) It shall be unlawful for a person to possess a	
6	loaded firearm while the person is intoxicated.		
7	(b) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a		
8	petty misdemeanor.		
9	(c) F	For purposes of this section:	
10	<u>(1)</u>	A person is in possession of a loaded firearm when the	
11	Į	person has immediate physical control over a loaded	
12	<u>f</u>	firearm and the person is outside of the person's

14	<u>(2)</u>	A person is intoxicated if the person:

8	SECTION 2	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9	matured, penal	ties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
