BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the university

3	program,	which shall be a five-year pilot program to further the
4	knowledge	and technical skills of young farmers.

14		business planning, business management, and grant

16	(1)	Offer and fund programs that provide education and

1 agricultural rehabilitation and vocational training 2 programs; and 3 (5) Advance land partnerships such as farm incubator 4 programs and educational programs on commercial farms 5 that teach agricultural and business skills. 6 Leeward community college may consult with any public (C) 7 or private entity, including the Hawaii Good Food Alliance, 8 Hawaii Farm Bureau, Hawaii Farmers Union United, and the 9 university of Hawaii's GoFarm Hawaii program, and 10 representatives therefrom, to carry out its duties under 11 contract with the pilot program established pursuant to this 12 Act. 13 (d) Leeward community college shall submit a report of its 14 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 15 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 16 to the convening of the regular session of 2029. 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 18 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 19 20 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 21 year 2024-2025 for the implementation of the farm succession
