A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on January 17, 1893,
- 2 the Kingdom of Hawaii witnessed the unjust and illegal overthrow
- 3 of its sovereign monarch, Queen Liliuokalani, resulting in the
- 4 disruption of the Hawaiian government and the sovereignty of the
- 5 Hawaiian people. The actions that led to the overthrow of Queen
- 6 Liliuokalani and the Kingdom of Hawaii were inconsistent with
- 7 the principles of justice, self-determination, and international
- **8** law.
- 9 In 1993, the United States Congress, through Public Law
- 10 103-150, formally acknowledged the role of the United States in
- 11 the illegal overthrow of the Kingdom of Hawaii and expressed
- 12 regret for the wrongful actions committed. In addition, Public
- 13 Law 103-150 recognized and supported the reconciliation efforts
- 14 that were initiated between the United States, the State, the
- 15 United Church of Christ, and the Native Hawaiian people.
- 16 The legislature finds that in the spirit of advancing those
- 17 initial efforts made towards reconciliation, it is imperative to

- 1 recognize and remember this historical injustice to ensure that
- 2 future generations are aware of the devastating negative impact
- 3 of the events of January 17, 1893, on the Hawaiian people and
- 4 their culture.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to designate
- 6 January 17 of each year as Reconciliation Day to commemorate the
- 7 memory of Queen Liliuokalani and the illegal overthrow of the
- 8 Kingdom of Hawaii.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 10 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 "§8- Reconciliation Day. January 17 of each year shall
- 13 be known as "Reconciliation Day" to commemorate the memory of
- 14 Queen Liliuokalani and the illegal overthrow of the Kingdom of
- 15 Hawaii. This day is not and shall not be construed to be a
- 16 state holiday."
- 17 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
