A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GASOLINE-POWERED LEAF BLOWERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that dozens of cities and
towns in the United States, the District of Columbia, and the
State of California have banned gasoline-powered leaf blowers
due to their harmful impacts on health and the environment.

5 The legislature finds that noise can be a pollutant that 6 affects the public health. Noise causes hearing loss, 7 interferes with human activities at home, work, in schools, and 8 is injurious to people's health and well-being in various ways. 9 Noise annoys, awakens, angers, and frustrates people. The 10 numerous effects of noise combine to detract from the quality of 11 people's lives and the environment.

12 The sound emissions from gasoline-powered leaf blowers are 13 a public nuisance and a great concern for the State's public 14 health and welfare. Gasoline-powered leaf blowers operate at 15 approximately ninety decibels, which can cause hearing damage 16 after two hours of exposure. According to the United States

1 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the noise intensity 2 is a particularly troubling issue for landscaping workers. 3 The legislature further finds that there are viable, 4 quieter alternatives to gasoline-powered leaf blowers such as 5 battery-powered leaf blowers. 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to ban the use of 7 gasoline-powered leaf blowers in any urban land use district. 8 SECTION 2. Section 342F-30.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "[+] §342F-30.8[+] Leaf blowers; restrictions [-]; and 11 prohibition of gasoline-powered leaf blowers. (a) In any urban 12 land use district, as designated pursuant to section 205-2, it 13 shall be unlawful for any person to operate a non-gasoline-14 powered leaf blower within a residential zone or within one 15 hundred feet of a residential zone in the State, except between 16 the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on any day except Sunday or 17 a state or federal holiday, and between the hours of 9:00 a.m. 18 and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday or any state or federal holiday. 19 (b) In any urban land use district, as designated pursuant to section 205-2, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate 20 21 a gasoline-powered leaf blower at any time.

16	"Gasoline-powered leaf blower" means any leaf blower that
17	is powered by a two-stroke internal combustion engine.
18	"Leaf blower" means any machine used to blow leaves, dirt,
19	or other debris off sidewalks, driveways, lawns, and other
20	surfaces.

"State holiday" means any day established as a state
holiday in section 8-1."
SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Gasoline-Powered Leaf Blowers; Prohibition; Fines; Government Agency Exemption; Repeal

Description:

Prohibits the operation of gasoline-powered leaf blowers in any urban land use districts. Increases the amounts of fines for offenses of leaf blower restrictions and provides for the forfeiture of gasoline-powered leaf blowers upon a third violation. Removes the exemption on leaf blower restrictions for government agencies. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)
