A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NEIGHBOR ISLANDS BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED SERVICE PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that thousands of Hawaii
- 2 residents have visual disabilities that hamper daily living and
- 3 may lead to isolation, limited productivity, loss of
- 4 independence, and lack of social integration. The department of
- 5 human services estimates that there are twelve thousand Hawaii
- 6 residents who are blind or have a significant visual impairment.
- 7 The legislature also finds that many blind or visually impaired
- 8 individuals live on Oahu where access to opportunities and
- 9 services are better organized and readily available compared to
- 10 the neighbor islands.
- 11 The legislature further finds that state and local support
- 12 services for blind or visually impaired individuals, including
- 13 training, adjustments to blindness services, and transportation
- 14 services, are provided through economies of scale, and
- 15 therefore, tend to benefit residents in populated areas as
- 16 compared to those in sparsely populated areas. As such,

- 5 Accordingly, the legislature finds that there is a need for
- 6 a supplemental service program that provides additional support
- 7 services to blind and visually impaired individuals residing on
- 8 neighbor islands.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 10 (1) Require the department of human services to:
- 11 (A) Establish a neighbor islands blind and visually
- impaired service pilot program that supplements
- existing statewide services by providing training
- 14 and other services to neighbor island residents
- who are blind or visually impaired;
- 16 (B) Establish a neighbor islands blind and visually
- impaired service pilot program working group and
- 18 submit a pilot program implementation plan to the
- 19 legislature before the Regular Session of 2024;

1		(C) Submit a report on the blind and visually
2		impaired service pilot program to the legislature
3		prior to the Regular Session of 2027; and
4	(2)	Appropriate moneys to fund the establishment and
5		operation of the neighbor islands blind and visually
6		impaired service pilot program and working group.
7	SECT	ION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
8	establish	a neighbor islands blind and visually impaired service
9	pilot pro	gram that provides training and other services to blind
10	and visua	lly impaired individuals residing on the neighbor
11	islands.	
12	(b)	The pilot program shall provide peer-to-peer outreach,
13	sight los	s adjustment, peer counseling support, and mobility
14	training	to program participants, including:
15	(1)	Outreach efforts to identify individual and program
16		needs;
17	(2)	Coordination with existing programs to ensure that
18		existing services are identified and used to the
19		maximum extent possible;
20	(3)	Adjustment services, including individual and group
21		counseling;

1	(4)	Access to and training for use of telecommunications
2		services to receive current news, weather alerts, and
3		other vital public information;
4	(5)	Awareness development and training for use of
5		computers, smart phones, and other communications
6		devices;
7	(6)	Daily living, self-care, and home management skills;
8	(7)	Orientation and mobility training;
9	(8)	Advocacy training and assistance to secure needed
10		benefits, services, and individual rights; and
11	(9)	Other services, including peer support needed for
12		program participants to sustain independence and
13		social integration.
14	The servi	ces of the pilot program pursuant to this subsection
15	shall be	provided by volunteers, who shall be recruited,
16	assigned,	and supervised by the department or an entity
17	contracte	d by the department to organize and implement the pilot
18	program.	All volunteers shall have the necessary
19	qualifica	tions, be chosen based on experience and training, and
20	use train	ing methods consistent with the structured discovery
21	approach	used by the new visions program operated by the Hoʻopono

- 1 services for the blind branch within the department's division
- 2 of vocational rehabilitation.
- 3 (c) The pilot program shall also provide program
- 4 participants with special needs transportation assistance. The
- 5 department shall work with neighbor island transportation
- 6 service providers and other individuals and entities to develop
- 7 a special needs transportation assistance service network to
- 8 serve program participants.
- 9 (d) Applications for participation in the pilot program
- 10 shall be submitted on a form furnished by the department. The
- 11 department shall establish procedures and requirements for
- 12 accepting program participants.
- 13 (e) The pilot program shall be authorized to extend and
- 14 supplement the existing services provided by the Ho'opono
- 15 services for the blind branch.
- (f) The department may enter into a contract with a
- 17 nonprofit organization to recruit, train, and supervise
- 18 volunteer service corps members and to oversee the pilot
- 19 program, provided that existing department personnel may be
- 20 assigned to fulfill administrative and fiscal responsibilities

1 of the pilot program. Any nonprofit organization contracted 2 under this subsection shall have: 3 The knowledge, experience, and qualifications (1) 4 necessary to provide peer support services to program 5 participants; 6 (2) A management team, consisting of officers and 7 directors, of which a majority are blind or visually impaired; and 9 (3) Membership chapters or organization subunits located 10 on the neighbor islands that will be served by the 11 pilot program. 12 The department shall establish a neighbor islands 13 blind and visually impaired service pilot program working group 14 composed of neighbor island residents who are blind or visually 15 impaired to make recommendations regarding the establishment and 16 implementation of the pilot program. The department, in **17** collaboration with the working group, shall develop a written 18 implementation plan that includes a pilot program performance

period and program budget, and shall submit the plan, including

any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than

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- 1 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 2 2024.
- 3 (h) The department shall submit a report of its findings
- 4 and recommendations pertaining to the neighbor islands blind and
- 5 visually impaired service pilot program to the legislature no
- 6 later than thirty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 7 session of 2027. The report shall include:
- 8 (1) A record of pilot program activities and
- 9 accomplishments;
- 10 (2) A recommendation on whether to extend the program; and
- 11 (3) Any proposed legislation.
- 12 (i) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 13 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and prescribe forms necessary to
- 14 carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 15 (j) For purposes of this section:
- 16 "Department" means the department of human services.
- 17 "Neighbor island" means a county with a population less
- 18 than five hundred thousand.
- 19 "Pilot program" means the neighbor islands blind and
- 20 visually impaired service pilot program established pursuant to
- 21 this Act.

1	"Program participant" means a resident of a neighbor island
2	whose mobility or ability to live independently is substantially
3	limited due to loss of sight and who is participating in the
4	pilot program.
5	"Special needs transportation" means transportation
6	provided to program participants at times or for trips when
7	public transportation is not a reasonable option.
8	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
11	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
12	year 2024-2025 to fund the establishment and operation of the
13	neighbor islands blind and visually impaired service pilot
14	program and working group; provided that:
15	(1) The department of human services shall include funding
16	for the pilot program in its regular budget request
17	submitted in 2024; and
18	(2) Any funds appropriated pursuant to this section shall
19	be in addition to and shall not supplant any portion
20	of the base budget for any state or county agency

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providing services for blind or visually impaired
persons.

The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
of human services for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,

2050, and shall be repealed on June 30, 2027.
