A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§45</u>	7- Temporary permit. (a) The board may issue a
5	temporary	permit to a practical nurse or registered nurse
6	licensed	in another jurisdiction who:
7	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
8		board;
9	(2)	Pays all applicable fees to the board as prescribed by
10		administrative rules;
11	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered license in
12		another state, territory, or country by way of a
13		license verification from the other state, territory,
14		or country, or Nursys license verification report as
15		prescribed by administrative rules;
16	(4)	Completes the fingerprinting requirement for a federal
17		and state criminal record check; and

1	(3)	Submitts to the board a certified copy of the seri
2		query report issued by the National Practitioner Data
3		Bank.
4	<u>(b)</u>	The board may issue a temporary permit to a nurse who
5	currently	holds a multistate license issued by another state,
6	territory	, or country; provided that the individual:
7	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
8		board;
9	(2)	Pays all applicable fees to the board as prescribed by
10		administrative rules;
11	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered multistate
12		license in another state, territory, or country by way
13		of a Nursys license verification report as prescribed
14		by administrative rules. For purposes of this
15		subsection, a "multistate license" means a license to
16		practice as a licensed practical nurse or registered
17		nurse issued by a home state licensing board that
18		authorizes the licensed nurse to practice in all party
19		states under a multistate licensure privilege; and

1	(4)	Submits to the board a certified copy of the self-
2		query report issued by the National Practitioner Data
3		Bank.
4	<u>(c)</u>	A temporary permit shall be issued only to an
5	applicant	who has been appointed or accepted employment with a
6	single he	alth care entity in the State listed in section 321-
7	11(10).	
8	<u>(d)</u>	A temporary permit shall be issued within ten business
9	days of t	he date the completed application is received by the
10	board and	shall be valid for a period of no longer than six
11	months fr	om the date of issuance.
12	<u>(e)</u>	Beginning July 1, 2025, notwithstanding sections 457-7
13	and 457-8	, an out-of-state registered nurse or licensed
14	practical	nurse may apply for a temporary permit based on the
15	requireme	nts of subsections (a) and (b), simultaneously with an
16	applicati	on for a license to practice as a registered nurse or
17	licensed	practical nurse in the State. Any out-of-state
18	registere	d nurse or licensed practical nurse applying
19	simultane	ously for a temporary permit and license to practice
20	shall be	required to submit only one application with a single,
21	non-refun	dable fee as prescribed by the board. A temporary

1	permit pursi	ant to this subsection shall be issued within ten
2	business day	ys of the date the completed application is received
3	by the board	d; provided that all criteria in subsections (a) or
4	(b), and (c)	have been met; provided further that the temporary

9	SECTION	N 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

19	(2) Er	ndorsement: The board may issue a license to
20	pı	cactice nursing as a registered nurse by endorsement
21	to	an applicant who has been licensed as a registered

2	foreign country if the applicant has an unencumbered
3	license and, in the opinion of the board, the
4	applicant meets the qualifications required of
5	registered nurses in this State at the time of
6	graduation. [Pending-verification of a-valid,

8	foreign-country, a temporary permit may be issued for
9	employment with a Hawaii employer.]"
10	SECTION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
12	"(b) Licenses shall be granted either by:
13	(1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
14	a written examination in nursing subjects as
15	determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
16	of the examination and compliance with the applicable
17	requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
18	board, the board shall issue to the applicant a
19	license to practice nursing as a licensed practical
20	nurse; or

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1	(2)	Endorsement: The board may issue a license to
2		practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by
3		endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as
4		a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to
5		perform similar services under a different title,
6		under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign
7		country if the applicant has an unencumbered license
8		and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets
9		the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this
10		State at the time of graduation. [Pending
11		verification of a valid, unencumbered license from
12		another state, territory, or foreign country, a
13		temporary permit may be issued for employment with a
14		Hawaii employer.]"
15	SECT	ION 4. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:
17	"§ 4 5	7-13 Exceptions. This chapter does not prohibit:
18	(1)	The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency;
19	(2)	The practice of nursing that is incidental to the
20		program of study engaged in by students enrolled in
21		nursing education programs accredited by the board;

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1	[(3)	The practice of nursing under a nonrenewable permit
2		by:
3		(A) A-graduate-of; or
4		(B) An applicant who has provided proof that the
5		applicant has completed the entire educational
6		curriculum required for graduation for a nursing
7		license from,
8		a school that is in or under the jurisdiction of the
9		United States, a territory, or a foreign jurisdiction,
10		and whose accreditation is recognized by the board;
11		provided that following completion of subparagraph (A)
12		or (B), the candidate takes the first licensing
13		examination scheduled by any board of nursing
14		recognized by the board and has submitted to the board
15		an application for a license to practice nursing in
16		the State; provided further that the permit shall be
17		valid for three months or until the results of the
18		licensing examination are received by the board;
19	(4)]	(3) The practice of any legally qualified nurse of
20		another state who is employed by the United States or

1		any bureau, division, or agency thereof, while in the
2		discharge of the nurse's official duties;
3	[(5)]	(4) The practice of nursing in connection with
4		healing by prayer or spiritual means alone in
5		accordance with the tenets and practice of any well
6		recognized church or religious denomination; provided
7		that no person practicing the nursing described in
8		this paragraph claims to practice as a registered
9		nurse or a licensed practical nurse; [or]
10	[-(6)-]	(5) The administration of oral and topical medication
11		and in emergency situations, other premeasured
12		medication, by school health assistants as provided in
13		section 302A-853[+]; or
14	<u>(6)</u>	The practice of nursing by a nurse licensed in another
15		state, territory, or country who is accompanying a
16		patient or patients from out of state for less than
17		two weeks and who is not employed by or affiliated
18		with a health care entity in the State."
19	SECT	ION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
20	may adopt	interim rules to establish fees for the administration
21	of this Ad	ct. All fees collected shall be deposited into the

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- 1 credit of the compliance resolution fund established pursuant to
- 2 section 26-9(o), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Fees assessed shall
- 3 be used to carry out the purposes of this Act without regard to
- 4 chapters 91 or 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that:
- 5 (1) The department shall hold at least one public hearing
- **6** prior to the adoption of interim rules; and
- 7 (2) The interim rules shall be effective for no more than
- 8 one year after their adoption.
- 9 SECTION 6. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
- 10 may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,
- 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, including one full-time equivalent (1.0
- 12 FTE) permanent office assistant, for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024;
- 16 provided that section 1 shall take effect on January 1, 2025.

Report Title:

Board of Nursing; Nurses; Registered Nurses; Practical Nurses; Temporary Permits; Licenses; Exceptions

Description:

Effective 1/1/2025, allows the Board of Nursing to issue temporary permits to out-of-state licensed registered nurses and practical nurses and nurses who hold a multistate license issued by another state, territory, or country, under certain circumstances. Beginning 7/1/2025, allows an out-of-state licensed practical nurse or registered nurse to apply for a temporary permit simultaneously with an application for a license to practice in the State. Excepts from license requirements nurses who are licensed in another state, territory, or country accompanying a patient from out-of-state for a period of less than two weeks and not employed or affiliated with a health care entity in the State.
