A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§14</u>	1- Healthy soils program; established. (a) The
5	departmen	t of agriculture shall establish a healthy soils
6	program.	The healthy soils program shall:
7	(1)	Create a healthy soil assessment and education
8		program;
9	(2)	Provide farmers with education and technical
10		assistance to implement farm management practices that
11		contribute to healthy soils;
12	(3)	Operate the healthy soil grants program;
13	(4)	Administer existing financial incentives to implement
14		farm management practices that contribute to healthy
15		soils, including the compost reimbursement program
16		under section 141-16 and cover crop reimbursement

3	(5)	Esta	blish other programs to accomplish the purposes of
4		the	healthy soils program based on the findings of the
5		gree	nhouse gas sequestration task force established

7	(b)	In a	dministering the healthy soil assessment and
8	education	prog	ram, the department shall:
9	(1)	Work	through technical assistance providers or
10		elig	ible entities to:
11		<u>(A)</u>	Encourage farmers, ranchers, and land managers to
12			undertake voluntary soil health measurements;
13		<u>(B)</u>	Raise awareness about desirable soil health
14			characteristics;
15		(C)	Facilitate on-site, producer-led workshops and
16			training sessions to promote and engender soil
17			health stewardship; and
18		<u>(D)</u>	Complete a baseline soil health assessment by
19			testing the organic matter, water infiltration
20			rate, microbiology, and aggregate stability of

1		soils, in addition to analyzing phospholipids and
2		monitoring soil cover;
3	(2)	Establish a statewide network of champions to promote
4		soil health stewardship, offer guidance to producers
5		and land managers, and encourage teamwork;
6	(3)	Create a program to provide ongoing training in soil
7		health stewardship and workshop facilitation for
8		champions and eligible entities;
9	(4)	In collaboration with technical assistance providers,
10		sponsor soil health workshops and training sessions at
11		research centers and learning sites throughout the
12		State; and
13	(5)	Educate students and the general public about the
14		importance of soil health stewardship.
15	(c)	In administering the health soil grants program, the
16	departmen	t shall:
17	(1)	Award grants to eligible entities to provide technical
18		assistance to producers and land managers in advancing
19		soil health principles and implementing supported
20		methods;

1	(2)	Award grants as financial assistance to eligible
2		farmers, ranchers, and other land managers who
3		implement soil health practices on their lands;
4	(3)	Develop a user-friendly grant program application and
5		application and reporting processes;
6	(4)	Develop criteria for the award of grants; provided
7		that grants shall be awarded equitably and priority
8		may be given to eligible entities serving young
9		producers, veterans, small farms, or ranches or for
10		projects that benefit economically or socially
11		disadvantaged communities; and
12	(5)	Ensure that grant funds are only used to advance soil
13		health and soil health stewardship.
14	<u>(d)</u>	The department shall encourage producer, land manager,
15	landowner	, and interagency collaboration in the management of
16	healthy s	oils and shall:
17	(1)	Work with technical assistance providers to advance
18		soil health stewardship across federal, state, and
19		private land jurisdictions by fostering collaboration
20		among producers, land managers, and landowners; and

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1	(2)	Conduct outreach to producers and land managers to		
2		promote the program and other federal, state, or local		
3		grant opportunities that support and promote healthy		
4		soils.		
5	(e)	The following standards shall apply to all grants		
6	<u>awarded u</u>	nder the program:		
7	(1)	Any grant shall be used exclusively for the purposes		
8		of the program;		
9	(2)	The grantee shall comply with all applicable federal		
10		and state laws prohibiting discrimination against any		
11		person on the basis of race, color, national origin,		
12		religion, creed, sex, age, sexual orientation,		
13		disability, or any other characteristic protected		
14		under applicable federal or state law;		
15	(3)	The grant shall not be used for purposes of		
16		entertainment or perquisites;		
17	(4)	All activities undertaken with grant funds received		
18		shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and		
19		county statutes and ordinances;		
20	(5)	The grantee shall:		

1		(A)	indemnity and noid narmitess the state of nawall
2			and its officers, agents, and employees from and
3			against any and all claims arising out of or
4			resulting from activities carried out or projects
5			undertaken with funds received from the program;
6			and
7		<u>(B)</u>	Obtain sufficient insurance to provide the
8			indemnification under subparagraph (A), if
9			requested to do so by the department of
10			agriculture; and
11	(6)	The	grantee shall agree to make available to the
12		depa	rtment of agriculture all records the grantee may
13		have	relating to the grant to monitor the grantee's
14		comp	liance with the requirements of the program.
15	<u>(f)</u>	The	department of agriculture shall adopt rules to
16	implement	the	grant program. The grant applications shall be
17	reviewed a	and a	pproved by an administrative staff member of the
18	department	<u>t.</u>	
19	<u>(g)</u>	The	department shall submit a report detailing the
20	status and	d pro	gress of the healthy soils program, including the
21	number of	aran	ts awarded the types of soil health practices

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- 1 being implemented, and the benefits to soil health and
- 2 agricultural productivity, and its recommendations, including
- 3 any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than
- 4 twenty days before the convening of each regular session."
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 8 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2024-2025 to establish the healthy soils program and to
- 10 issue grants and other financial incentives pursuant to the
- 11 program.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 13 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
