A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHING SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing state law
- 2 protects fishers from harassment if they are taking fish
- 3 pursuant to a freshwater game fishing license. There is a need
- 4 to extend these protections to all persons fishing in marine
- 5 waters to promote the safety and enjoyment of individuals
- 6 engaged in fishing activities.
- 7 The legislature further finds that makai watch is an
- 8 official program of the department of land and natural
- 9 resources, which enhances protection of nearshore and coastal
- 10 resources by providing community members opportunities to work
- 11 and interact with resource managers and enforcement officers in
- 12 their community. The makai watch program plays an important
- 13 role as the eyes and ears of the division of conservation and
- 14 resources enforcement. Makai watch volunteers participate in
- 15 two types of activities:
- 16 (1) Observation and incident reporting; and
- 17 (2) Awareness raising and outreach.



- 1 Volunteers in the makai watch program are trained to conduct
- 2 these activities in a manner that does not interfere with
- 3 fishing activities.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 5 (1) Prohibit purposeful harassment with the intent to
- 6 prevent the taking of fish by people who are fishing;
- 7 and
- **8** (2) Extend protections against harassment to all persons
- 9 fishing in marine waters.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 188-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §188-71[+] Harassment of [fishermen;] fishers;
- 13 prohibition. (a) No person shall intentionally prevent or
- 14 attempt to prevent the lawful taking of fish by a person
- 15 [licensed-pursuant to section 188-50] fishing in state waters
- 16 by [+] purposely:
- 17 (1) Placing the person's self in a location in which human
- presence may affect the behavior of fish to be taken
- or the feasibility of taking such fish;
- 20 (2) Creating a visual, aural, olfactory, or physical
- 21 stimulus to affect the behavior of fish to be taken;

1	(3)	Affecting the condition or placement of personal							
2		property intended for use in the taking; or							
3	(4)	Obstructing the person's access to areas in which the							
4		person intends to lawfully take fish[-],							
5	with the intent to prevent the taking of fish.								
6	(b)	No person shall enter or remain upon public lands or							
7	waters, o	r upon private lands or waters, without permission of							
8	the owner	or the owner's agent, with intent to violate this							
9	section.								
10	<u>(c)</u>	It shall not be a violation of subsection (a) to:							
11	(1)	Take photographs or video recording of a person							
12		engaged in the taking of fish or related activities							
13		while over one hundred feet away from the person; or							
14	(2)	Engage in activities pursuant to the department of							
15		land and natural resources' makai watch program.							
16	[(c)	d) The maximum penalty for violation of subsection							
17	(a) or (b) is a fine of \$500, thirty days imprisonment, or							
18	both."								
19	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that							
20	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were							
21	begun before its effective date.
