## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEARCH AND RESCUE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is an outdoor 2 playground world-renowned for its beautiful hikes through lush 3 green forests and mountains. However, the coronavirus pandemic 4 fueled a sustained surge of experienced and inexperienced hikers 5 venturing outdoors. Occasionally, hikers ignore posted warning signs, intentionally leave a hiking trail, or enter property 6 7 that is closed to the public. When one of these hikers needs to 8 be rescued, it is government entities that bear the costs 9 associated with the search or rescue.

10 The legislature further finds that in response to having to 11 pay the cost of rescuing recreational hikers who take 12 unnecessary risks, several states, including Idaho, Maine, New 13 Hampshire, Oregon, South Dakota, and Vermont, have passed 14 legislation that allows the state to offset the costs associated 15 with the search or rescue by seeking reimbursement from the 16 rescued party.

matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
