A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VEGETATIVE BURNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a
- 2 connection between the protection of the environment and public
- 3 health. The most significant health threat of commercial
- 4 burning results from the inhalation of fine particulates
- 5 produced when wood and other organic materials burn. According
- 6 to the Environmental Protection Agency, exposure to fine
- 7 particulate air pollution has been linked with respiratory and
- 8 cardiovascular conditions, including but not limited to asthma,
- 9 chronic bronchitis, irregular heartbeat, heart attacks, and the
- 10 risk of death for individuals suffering from heart disease or
- 11 lung disease. Studies have shown racial and ethnic minorities
- 12 have been found to be exposed at higher rates to air pollution
- 13 based on factors such as socioeconomic status, area of
- 14 residence, occupation, and neighborhood segregation.
- 15 The legislature further finds that preventative measures
- 16 against air pollution may save lives. Federal legislation, such
- 17 as the Clean Air Act, aid in the reduction of air pollution. A

- 1 2020 study found that poor air quality and air pollution derived
- 2 from human activities lead to over one hundred thousand deaths
- 3 in the United States during a single year. Decreasing the
- 4 concentration of fine air particulate pollution lowers the risk
- 5 of all-cause mortality.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the issuance of
- 7 permits for commercial vegetative burning in residential
- 8 neighborhoods or within the vicinity of residential areas.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 342B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§342B- Vegetative burning in residential areas. The
- 13 department shall not issue permits for the commercial burning of
- 14 green waste products within residential areas or areas within
- 15 one thousand feet of a residential property.
- 16 This prohibition shall not apply to the permitted roasting
- of coffee."
- 18 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
