A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§378- Paid rest periods; paid meal periods. (a)		
5	Employees shall be allowed:		
6	(1) A paid rest period of at least fifteen consecutive		
7	minutes for each four hours of working time; and		
8	(2) A paid meal period of at least thirty consecutive		
9	minutes for each eight hours of working time."		
10	SECTION 2. Section 390-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:		
12	"(c) A minor who has attained the age of fourteen years		
13	but not sixteen years may be employed or permitted to work:		
14	(1) During periods when the minor is not legally required		
15	to attend school or when the minor is excused by		
16	school authorities from attending school;		

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1	(2)	If the employer of the minor procures and keeps on
2		file a valid certificate of employment;
3	(3)	No more than [five] eight hours [continuously] without
4		an interval of at least thirty consecutive minutes for
5		a [rest or lunch period;
6	(4)]	<pre>paid meal break;</pre>
7	(4)	No more than four hours without an interval of at
8		least fifteen consecutive minutes for a paid rest
9		break;
10	(5)	Between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. of any day; provided
11		that during any authorized school break, the minor may
12		be employed between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.;
13	[(5)]	(6) No more than six consecutive days;
14	[(6)]	(7) No more than eighteen hours in a calendar week
15		during which the minor is legally required to attend
16		school, and no more than forty hours in a calendar
17		week during which the minor is not legally required to
18		attend school or when the minor is excused by school
19		authorities from attending school;
20	[-(7)-]	(8) No more than three hours on any school day; and
21	[(8)]	(9) No more than eight hours on any nonschool day."
