A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CARE FACILITY INSPECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 321-1.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]§321-1.8[+] Inspections; public notice. Beginning with inspections occurring on January 1, 2015, the 5 department of health shall post on its website electronic copies 6 of separate reports for all [inspections it] inspection visits, 7 violations, plans of correction, and confirmations of 8 implementation of plans of correction that the department 9 performs [of] or issues for the following state-licensed care facilities: 10 11 (1) Adult day health centers; 12 (2) Adult day care centers; 13 (3) Community care foster family homes; 14 (4)Developmental disabilities domiciliary homes as 15 defined in section 321-15.9; 16 Developmentally disabled adult foster homes; (5)

5	(b)	[Each report] The following reports shall be posted or
6	the depart	tment of health's website [within five working days of
7	the concl	usion of each inspection and shall include the
8	following	information: within the following timeframes:
9	(1)	[The date of the] For the initial inspection[;] visit,
10		the report shall be posted within five working days of
11		the conclusion of the initial inspection visit;
12	(2)	A description of violations of relevant state laws or
13		rules, if applicable[+], shall be posted within
14		fifteen working days of the conclusion of the initial
15		inspection visit;
16	(3)	Plans of correction and the status of corrective
17		actions in response to any violations, if
18		applicable[+], shall be posted within thirty working
19		days of the conclusion of the initial inspection
20		visit;

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1	(4)	A list and description of all corrective actions taken	
2		by the facility, if applicable, to be submitted by the	
3		facility and added to the report at a later time, as	
4		determined by the department[+], shall be posted	
5		within sixty working days of the plan of correction's	
6		submission; and	
7	(5)	Other information regarding the quality and conditions	
8		of the facility the department of health deems	
9		appropriate[-], including complaints registered with	
10		the department, shall be posted within five working	
11		days of the conclusion of the inspection.	
12	<u>(c)</u>	The department of health shall log each report in a	
13	database	designed for easy public posting.	
14	[-(c) -] (d) Each report posted on the department of health's	
15	website that reports a violation committed by a state-licensed		
16	care facility as described in subsection (a) shall be removed		
17	from the website after three years from the date the report was		
18	posted[-]; provided that each facility inspected by the		
19	department shall maintain a record of all inspection visits,		
20	violations, and plans of correction and shall notify the		
21	executive	office on aging, office of the long-term care

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Report Title:

Kupuna Caucus; Department of Health; Inspections; Public Notice; Website; Initial Inspection Visits; Databases; Executive Office on Aging; Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman; County Offices on Aging

Description:

Requires the Department of Health to post on its website separate reports for various visits, violations, plans, and confirmations the Department performs or issues of certain care facilities. Establishes deadlines for each report type. Requires the Department of Health to log all reports in a database designed for easy public posting. Requires all facilities inspected by the Department of Health to maintain certain records and notify the Executive Office on Aging, Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman, and appropriate county offices on aging of initial inspection visit dates.

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
