A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUACULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established an aquaculture
- 2 development branch within the department of business, economic
- 3 development, and tourism to generate diversified agriculture
- 4 solutions for moving the State towards greater food self-
- 5 sufficiency and foster viable export industries, and to provide
- 6 a broad range of support to new and existing aquaculture and
- 7 livestock businesses through planning and coordination, business
- 8 counseling, and information dissemination efforts.
- 9 (b) The department of business, economic development, and
- 10 tourism shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes, necessary to effectuate the purpose of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 2. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
- 13 the aquaculture and livestock support services branch within the
- 14 department of agriculture are transferred to the aquaculture
- 15 development branch within the department of business, economic
- 16 development and tourism.

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1 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose 2 functions are transferred to the aquaculture development branch within the department of business, economic development, and 3 tourism by this Act shall retain their civil service status, 4 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred 5 without loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by 6 applicable collective bargaining agreements), retention points, 7 prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits 8 9 previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, 10 in accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public 11 employment requirements for the class or position to which 12 13 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that 14 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable 15 civil service and compensation laws. 16 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 17 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed 18 19 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An 20 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer 21 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits

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- 1 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 2 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 3 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 4 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 5 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 6 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of
- 7 the department of business, economic development, and tourism
- 8 may prescribe the duties and qualifications of these employees
- 9 and fix their salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes.
- 11 SECTION 3. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 12 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 13 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 14 acquired, or held by the aquaculture and livestock support
- 15 services branch within the department of agriculture relating to
- 16 the functions transferred to the aquaculture development branch
- 17 within the department of business, economic development, and
- 18 tourism shall be transferred with the functions to which they
- 19 relate.
- 20 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 3 year 2024-2025 for the establishment of an aquaculture
- 4 development branch within the department of business, economic
- 5 development, and tourism.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 7 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 8 of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 12 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 13 year 2024-2025 for the establishment of full-time
- 14 equivalent (FTE) permanent positions within the
- 15 aquaculture development branch established pursuant to this Act.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 18 of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
