SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT A POLICY RELATING TO THE USE OF PREFERRED NAMES FOR STUDENTS.

1	WHEREAS, the use of an individual's name assigned at birth,
2	rather than their preferred name, is often referred to as
3	"deadnaming"; and
4 5	WHEREAS, failing to use a student's preferred name on
5 6	student records and in campus settings can undermine the
0 7	emotional well-being of transgender, Indigenous, minority, and
8	other children, leading to bullying, discrimination, violence,
o 9	and loss of educational and economic opportunities; and

11	WHEREAS, deadnaming in educational settings is a common
12	practice, but research has found that using students' preferred
13	names is associated with improved mental health outcomes; and
14	names is associated with improved mental health succomes, and
15	WHEREAS, a 2018 study published in the <i>Journal of</i>
16	Adolescent Health found that using transgender youths' preferred
17	names in more contexts was associated with lower rates of
18	depression, suicidal ideation, and suicidal behavior, and that
19	the odds of each were lowest when preferred names were used in
20	more contexts; and

22	WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii has already adopted a
23	policy by which any student may use a preferred name to foster
24	an inclusive and supportive campus environment; now, therefore,

29	is requested to adopt a policy relating to the use of preferred

es the Department to update any records for t or former students to include the preferred bon the request of the student, including but mited to school-issued email addresses, campus fication cards, class rosters, diplomas, cates of completion of courses, or other t records; and
s that the Department shall not charge a fee for ring, updating, or reissuing a document or based on the declaration of a preferred name;
