SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO COLLABORATE WITH
THE STATE TO EXPAND COMMUNITY GARDENING OPPORTUNITIES FOR
RESIDENTS.

1 WHEREAS, the ability to cultivate a garden has been proven
2 to provide health benefits for people of all ages by reducing
3 stress, providing a form of low intensity exercise, and
4 increasing vitamin D production; and

6 WHEREAS, gardening can serve as a source of organic,
7 healthy, and affordable food options for not only the gardeners,
8 but their friends and family with whom they share their crops;

11 WHEREAS, cities with large green spaces see a range of
12 social benefits, such as reduction in air pollution, reduced
13 heat, and more abundant wildlife; and

15 WHEREAS, in a city like Honolulu, where much of Oahu's
16 population resides in condominiums and densely populated
17 neighborhoods, community garden programs can serve as a respite
18 from the loud noise and fast pace of city living; and

20 WHEREAS, community gardening has become increasingly
21 popular in the City and County of Honolulu, with citizens
22 recognizing the numerous benefits of cultivating their own food
23 and engaging with nature; and

25 WHEREAS, demand for community garden spaces has rapidly
26 outpaced available supply; and

28 WHEREAS, the Ala Wai Community Garden exemplifies this
29 popularity, evidenced by its extensive waitlist of over one
30 hundred fifty community members eager to participate in
31 gardening activities and reap the health and wellness benefits
