SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO INVESTIGATE AND IMPLEMENT POLICIES TO REDUCE THE IMPORTATION OF PRODUCTS, PACKAGING, OR MATERIALS CONTAINING PERFLUOROALKYL AND POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES INTO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, 1 2 commonly known as PFAS, or forever chemicals, are persistent 3 toxic substances that can contaminate drinking water, 4 bioaccumulate in fish and wildlife, have adverse health effects on humans, and do not break down in the environment; and 5 6 WHEREAS, scientific studies have shown that exposure to 7 PFAS is harmful to the health and well-being of humans and 8 wildlife; and 9 10 WHEREAS, PFAS exposure has been linked to increased 11 12 cholesterol levels, lower antibody response to some vaccines, changes in liver enzymes, pregnancy-induced hypertension and 13 preeclampsia, decreases in birth weight, kidney and testicular 14 cancer, and decreased fertility; and 15 16 WHEREAS, despite the adverse health effects, PFAS continue 17 to be used in a variety of products, packaging, and materials 18 that are imported into the State; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency 21 has promulgated rules to dramatically reduce maximum contaminant 22 levels for PFAS in drinking water, but has not yet taken action 23 to phase out the production of PFAS or their use in a wide 24 variety of everyday products; and 25 26 WHEREAS, any PFAS imported into the State pose a risk to 27 human health and will eventually enter the food chain and 28 contaminate already scarce drinking water aguifers; and 29 30

WHEREAS, the State has a duty to protect the health and 1 2 safety of the public; and 3 WHEREAS, the State should limit, to the extent possible, 4 5 the further importation of new PFAS into Hawaii; now, therefore, 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 8 9 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health is urged to investigate and implement policies to reduce 10 the importation of products, packaging, or materials containing 11 PFAS into the State; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 14 requested to pursue funding for the implementation of the 15 investigation to reduce the importation of products, packaging, 16 or materials containing PFAS into the State; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health 20 21 and Deputy Director for Environmental Health Administration.
