SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT A TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY DATA GOVERNANCE TASK FORCE BE CONVENED TO ASSESS CURRENT DEMOGRAPHIC DATA COLLECTION, PROCESSING, RETENTION, AND SHARING PROCEDURES UTILIZED BY ALL STATE AGENCIES.

WHEREAS, Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and other
Pacific Islanders represent 46.5 percent of the State's
population; and

5 WHEREAS, while Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and other 6 Pacific Islanders are often misrepresented as a homogenous 7 group, they are an extremely diverse group, comprising 8 ethnicities from over thirty different countries, who experience 9 diverse social, educational, health, and economic differences 10 that are unique to their respective communities; and 11

WHEREAS, the United States Office of Management and Budget's Statistical Policy Directive No. 15, entitled "Race and Ethnic Standards for Federal Statistics and Administrative Reporting," separated the "Asian and Pacific Islander" category into two distinct and separate categories, now called "Asians" and "Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders", which were used in the 2020 United States Census; and

WHEREAS, despite the federal government's current policy and practice of disaggregating data related to Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and other Pacific Islanders, not all of the State's agencies keep demographic data in a standard or uniform manner that comports with prevailing federal standards; and

26 WHEREAS, most state agencies do not make collected 27 demographic data accessible to the public so that regional and 28 local governments, elected officials, decision makers, and other 29 stakeholders can use the information to strategically target 30 programs for those most in need; and 31



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WHEREAS, given the diversity of languages and cultures, 1 separating data for Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and other 2 Pacific Islander ethnic groups is imperative and making data 3 publicly accessible is critical for enhancing understanding of 4 the needs and experiences of different communities across the 5 6 State: and 7 WHEREAS, the State has unique trust responsibilities with 8 respect to Native Hawaiians, which are administered by a variety 9 10 of state agencies; and 11 WHEREAS, uniform collection and sharing of data specific to 12 Native Hawaiians is critical to the proper administration of the 13 State's trust responsibilities and improving the conditions of 14 15 Native Hawaiians through other similar initiatives; now, therefore, 16 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the House of Representatives concurring, that this body is requested 20 to convene a task force to develop a twenty-first century data 21 governance task force to assess current demographic data 22 23 collection, processing, retention, and sharing procedures utilized by all state agencies; and 24 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to include the following members or their designees: 27 28 29 (1) The Director of the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development; 30 31 The Chief Information Officer of the Office of 32 (2)33 Enterprise Technology Services; 34 35 (3) The Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs; 36 37 38 (4) The Director of the Department of Health's Office of Health Equity; and 39 40 Other relevant members to be identified and invited by 41 (5) 42 the task force; and



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1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 3 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 4 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 5 2025; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 9 dissolve on June 30, 2025; and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 11 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 12 Office of Planning and Sustainable Development, Chief 13 Information Officer of the Office of Enterprise Technology 14 15 Services, Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and Director of the Department of Health's Office of 16 Health Equity. 17 18 19 20
