# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE CAPITOL MODERN MUSEUM AND STATE FOUNDATION ON  
CULTURE AND THE ARTS TO INCREASE OPPORTUNITIES FOR ARTISTS,  
SONGWRITERS, AND PRODUCERS TO SHOWCASE THEIR TALENT ON A  
PUBLIC PLATFORM WHILE FOSTERING ACCESS TO ALL FORMS OF ART.

1           WHEREAS, the Capitol Modern is a free public art museum  
2 located in downtown Honolulu that enhances the profound  
3 combination of mixed cultures of the State of Hawaii while  
4 providing educational learning experiences to the general public  
5 and youth; and

6  
7           WHEREAS, in 1967, Hawaii became the first state in the  
8 nation to adopt a percent-for-art law with the enactment of the  
9 Art in State Buildings law, which designates one percent of  
10 construction costs of new buildings for the acquisition of works  
11 of art, either by commission or purchase; and

12  
13           WHEREAS, the purpose of the Art in State Buildings law is  
14 to elevate and humanize state buildings and to increase public  
15 access to the arts; and

16  
17           WHEREAS, in 1989, the Legislature created the Works of Art  
18 Special Fund, expanding upon the provisions of the Art in State  
19 Buildings law to include having works of art available to all  
20 state public places; and

21  
22           WHEREAS, there are now more than three hundred public art  
23 programs nationwide at the federal, state, and county levels;  
24 and

26           WHEREAS, since the enactment of the Art in State Buildings  
27 law, the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts (SFCA) has  
28 acquired works from local and international artists and from  
29 curated exhibits across the State; and



1 WHEREAS, works of art enhance the physical environment of  
2 state buildings while providing educational experiences of  
3 visual arts to the public through the Art in Public Places  
4 Program; and

6 WHEREAS, the work of the program partners and youth  
7 participants further encourages a celebration of arts and  
8 culture while elevating Hawaiian culture and other heritages  
9 through displays of work representing different social groups,  
10 nations, and customs; and

11  
12 WHEREAS, the youth art programs raise awareness about art  
13 education while creating diversity in the representation of  
14 cultures and equity for all youth who want to compete; and

15  
16 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the value of student  
17 artist internships and art education as important foundations to  
18 teach, train, equip, and empower student artists, to encourage  
19 local talent, and help independent producers grow their  
20 artistry; and

21  
22 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the Hawaiian  
23 culture personifies the people of Hawaii with an identity that  
24 makes our State unique, original, and different; now, therefore,

25  
26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second  
27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the  
28 House of Representatives concurring, that the Capitol Modern  
29 museum and State Foundation on Culture and the Arts are  
30 encouraged to increase opportunities for artists, songwriters,  
31 and producers to showcase their talent on a public platform  
32 while fostering access to all forms of art, including fine arts,  
33 performing arts, music, filmmaking, digital arts, literature,  
34 wood carving, photography, ceramics, modern art, and creative  
35 media; and

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Capitol Modern museum and  
38 State Foundation on Culture and the Arts are urged to focus on  
39 education, extracurricular activity, and career development  
40 strategies for art students from kindergarten through twelfth  
41 grade and at the college level to enhance their learning  
42 experience with access to career pathways, scholarships, grants,



1 and apprenticeship opportunities, with a prioritization on  
2 marginalized schools and students; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Capitol Modern museum and  
5 State Foundation on Culture and the Arts are urged to develop  
6 collaborations with other art-focused entities, including the  
7 Honolulu Mayor's Office of Culture and the Arts, Hawaii Theatre,  
8 Honolulu Youth Theatre, Diamond Head Theatre, Hawaii Youth  
9 Symphony, Honolulu Community College Music & Entertainment  
10 Learning Experience, University of Hawaii-West Oahu Creative  
11 Media Program, Creative Lab Hawai'i, and Entrepreneurs Sandbox;

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Capitol Modern museum and  
15 State Foundation on Culture and the Arts are urged to consider  
16 partnering with public and private schools nationally and across  
17 the State to equip and empower youth to elevate their art  
18 productions while further creating accessibility in art  
19 programming and resources for the youth of Hawaii, including but  
20 not limited to performances, classes, and training; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Capitol Modern museum and  
23 State Foundation on Culture and the Arts are urged to focus on  
24 exemplifying the Hawaiian culture through its collaborations,  
25 partnerships, and displays of art; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant  
29 Governor, Executive Director of the State Foundation on Culture  
30 and the Arts, Director of the Capitol Modern museum, Executive  
31 Director of the Honolulu Mayor's Office of Culture and the Arts,  
32 President and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Theatre,  
33 President and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Youth  
34 Symphony, Executive Director of the Diamond Head Theatre, and  
35 Managing Director of the Honolulu Theatre for Youth.
