SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES, OFFICE OF PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, AND COUNTY OF MAUI TO INVENTORY AND MAP EXISTING R-1 WATER DELIVERY SYSTEMS AND RESERVOIRS IN MAUI COUNTY.

WHEREAS, within Maui County, an average of more than 1 8,700,000 gallons of treated wastewater is disposed of every day 2 using injection wells, causing groundwater contamination, algae 3 blooms, and coral reef damage in nearshore waters; and 4 5 WHEREAS, to prevent and mitigate further environmental 6 harm, additional infrastructure is needed for treatment, 7 distribution, and storage of reclaimed water for subsequent use; 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the most desirable uses for reclaimed water are 11 for emergency firefighting and for irrigation of agricultural 12 lands and landscaping; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in August 2023, a wildfire in Lahaina burned an 15 estimated 2,170 acres, killing at least one hundred individuals, 16 17 injuring many others, and destroying or damaging approximately two thousand two hundred structures; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, it is preferable to use recycled fresh water from reservoirs to fight wildfires, rather than ocean water, because 21 the salinity from ocean water alters the chemical composition of 22 the affected soil, leading to barren landscapes that are unable 23 to support native plant life and experience intensified erosion, 24 which carries the salinized soil to other areas; and 25 26 WHEREAS, providing firefighters with access to stored 27 28 reclaimed water with which to fight fires will increase public safety and protect affected lands; and 29





1 WHEREAS, water is a scarce and valuable commodity that 2 3 should not be disposed of without careful consideration; and 4 5 WHEREAS, without increasing the use of reclaimed water in the State, residents will encounter potable drinking water 6 shortages caused by the overuse of potable drinking water for 7 agricultural, landscaping, or firefighting purposes; and 8 9 WHEREAS, using former plantation reservoirs to store 10 11 reclaimed water will allow for easier access for agricultural and landscaping use for West Maui and will provide firefighters 12 with efficient access to fresh water; and 13 14 WHEREAS, an important first step in increasing the use of 15 reclaimed water is to create accurate inventories and maps of 16 existing R-1 water delivery systems and reservoirs that may be 17 used for reclaimed water storage; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, R-1 water refers to water recycled from wastewater that has undergone oxidation, filtration, and disinfection; now, 21 therefore, 22 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 25 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 26 and Natural Resources, Office of Planning and Sustainable 27 28 Development, and County of Maui are requested to create an inventory of, and produce maps that identify, existing R-1 water 29 30 delivery systems and reservoirs in Maui County; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 32 Natural Resources, Office of Planning and Sustainable 33 Development, and County of Maui are requested to submit the 34 35 inventory and maps to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; 39 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources; Director 40 of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Director of the 41





Office of Planning and Sustainable Development; and Mayor of the
County of Maui.

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
