## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

15 16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, certified arborists, or professional individuals who are equipped to plant, prune, transplant, fertilize, monitor and treat for insects and diseases, and remove trees and other woody plants, have an obligation to perform work that meets these industry standards and best practices; and		
22 23 24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, pursuant to section 26-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has the duty to manage and administer the public lands of the State, including the soil conservation function and all activities on and within the forests, forest reserves, and state parks, and to promote the conservation, development, and utilization of forests, including forest reserves; now, therefore,
