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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A STATEWIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CURRICULA PLAN FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN GRADES KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE.

WHEREAS, according to a 2021 United States Surgeon General's Advisory on protecting youth mental health, the growing use of digital social media; increased academic pressure; limited access to mental health care; health risk behaviors such as drug and alcohol use; broader stressors such as finance, income inequality, and racism, all contribute to the upward trend in mental health challenges facing young people; and

WHEREAS, a 2021 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention analysis states that nearly forty percent of high school students reported experiencing poor mental health during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic and forty-four percent of high school students reported persistent feelings of sadness or helplessness in the prior year; and

WHEREAS, providing behavioral health education in the State's public schools can assist students to better understand their feelings about, and responses to, various situations and where to get help; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is requested to develop and implement a statewide behavioral health curricula plan for public school students in kindergarten through twelfth grade; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the curriculum include but not be limited to age-appropriate information on:

(1) Mental and emotional health;
