SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO EVALUATE HAWAII RESIDENTS' ENGAGEMENT WITH ADDICTIVE ONLINE ACTIVITIES.

WHEREAS, in 2023, thirty-three states, including Hawaii, 1 filed a suit against Meta Platforms, Inc.; Instagram, LLC; and 2 other companies for deliberately designing addictive features on 3 4 their platforms; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the State does not tolerate disingenuous and predatory practices against children; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, excessive social media use is one of a wide range 10 of online activities that individuals may engage with problematically; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, many online activities are largely unregulated and 14 unmonitored; and 15 WHEREAS, many users engage with addictive or problematic 16 17 online activities privately and anonymously, inhibiting recognition of the problem by oneself, family, or partners; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, a government cannot know what supports and safeguards are needed for its constituents without understanding 21 the behaviors or activities the constituents engage in; and 22 23 WHEREAS, various vulnerable and underserved communities in 24 25 Hawaii are disproportionately engaged in addictive or problematic online activities; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, conducting a prevalence survey may help inform capacity-building efforts needed to best serve the people of 29 Hawaii; now, therefore, 30 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 33 that the Department of Health is urged to conduct a study to 34 35 evaluate Hawaii residents' engagement with a range of online

2	disproportionately affect vulnerable and minority populations;

5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to better understand local
6	participation in potentially addictive online activities, the
7	Department of Health is urged to deploy as part of the study, a
8	prevalence survey to measure social media, internet gaming,
9	pornography, mobile phone use, gambling, and high-risk stock and
10	crypto currency trading; and
