SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO ESTABLISH A SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP AN INTERAGENCY FOOD SYSTEMS PLAN.

WHEREAS, food security is a critical issue in the State; and

WHEREAS, the State imports eight-five percent of its food, making it vulnerable to natural and man-made disasters; and

WHEREAS, the State should be proactive in making its local food production more resilient; and

WHEREAS, a sustainable food system is a food system in which producers, retailers, community members, non-governmental organizations, and government agencies partner to create a vibrant and resilient local food economy that enhances and sustains the environmental, economic, and social health of the community; and

WHEREAS, the development of a sustainable food system for the State would support "green" job creation, sustainable economic development, land stewardship, and climate change resiliency; and

WHEREAS, a coordinated food systems plan lead by key stakeholders across the State is critical to develop a sustainable and equitable food economy; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the Department of Agriculture is requested to establish a Sustainable Food Systems Working Group to develop an interagency food systems plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, or the Chairperson's designee, and the Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, or the Director's
