SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR'S SENIOR ADVISOR FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND THE JUSTICE SYSTEM TO DEFINE THEIR ROLE AND TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE PROGRESS THE STATE HAS MADE TOWARDS JAIL DIVERSION.

1 WHEREAS, the Governor's Senior Advisor for Mental Health and the Justice System has an undefined role; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the uniqueness and importance of having a position 4 in the Office of the Governor that is dedicated to mental health 5 and the justice system makes the Senior Advisor for Mental 6 Health and the Justice System a de facto lead on mental health 7 and the justice system initiatives for the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, on February 5, 2024, at a joint informational 10 briefing where participants were requested to bring data in 11 support of their presentation, the Governor's Senior Advisor for 12 Mental Health and the Justice System provided the Substance 13 Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) model 14 on jail diversion, but provided no other data; and 15 16 WHEREAS, on February 5, 2024, the Department of Health 17 presented that, for a one-year period, only one percent of post-18 booking jail diversion referrals were accepted; and 19 20 WHEREAS, pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 117, 21 S.D. 1, H.D 1 (2007), as former co-chair of the established task 22 force, Governor Green recommended community-based services to 23 24 avoid readmission to the Hawaii State Hospital and a community secure residential program operated by CARE Hawaii, Inc. as a 25 26 form of jail diversion; and 27 WHEREAS, by letter dated February 8, 2024, and at the 28 latest informational briefing, the Chairperson of the Senate 29 Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the 30 Chairperson of the Senate Standing Committee on Commerce and 31

Please also include within the 17 18 Governor's plans, his plan to reduce the population in the 19 Hawaii State Hospital"; and 20 21 WHEREAS, on February 23, 2024, the Governor's Senior Advisor for Mental Health and the Justice System presented in 22 response to the Senators' requests the Judiciary's report, which 23 provided data on seven hundred and four mental assessments 24 25 conducted, but otherwise provided no additional data on the various community programs funded since the 2008 report to the 26 Legislature pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 117, 27 S.D. 1, H.D 1 (2007) and whether any of those programs fit into 28 29 the SAMHSA intercept model; now, therefore, 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 32 that the Governor's Senior Advisor for the Mental Health and the 33 Justice System is urged to define their role and to provide an 34 35 annual report to the Legislature on the progress the State has made towards jail diversion; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Senior Advisor 38 for Mental Health and the Justice System is requested to: 39 40 (1) Gather data on the various community programs funded 41 42 by the Department of Human Services, Department of
